

KUVEMPU UNIVERSITY GRACING REGULATIONS

PREAMBLE

All the Universities in Karnataka State conduct examinations to candidates appearing for various degrees in the Faculty of Science, Arts, Commerce, Law, Engineering, Medicine etc. So far each University in Karnataka has its own regulations regarding the benefit of gracing given to the student to pass in any particular subject/subjects in any of the above examinations. In order to maintain certain uniformity in the benefit of gracing marks given to students to pass the subject of an examination, it was felt that there is a necessity to revise the existing regulations so as to bring out a common uniform rules to be adopted by all the Universities in Karnataka.

SCHEDULE

1. These gracing Regulations shall apply to all the examinations conducted by the Kuvempu University and shall become operative for all examinations conducted from the date of assent of the Chancellor.
2. In these Regulations, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context, 'Paper' means:
 - (i) Paper which has a separate minima for pass
 - OR
 - (ii) Practicals/clinical/Viva voce which have a separate minima for pass.

(Explanation: Paper means; theory, practicals, clinicals and viva voce having separate minima for pass conducted by University.)



3. One percent of the maximum marks of the paper or papers of the examination taken by the candidate shall be treated as marks available for gracing.

(Explanation: If in any examination, 500 marks is the maxima for subjects prescribed, the number of marks available for gracing the subjects is only five marks.)

4. Subject to regulation No.3, gracing in any paper/s shall not exceed two percent of the maximum marks of that paper/s.

(Explanation; (i) If the candidate in any examination appears for more than one subject, he is entitled to avail a grace of two percent of the maximum of the marks available in any subject or subjects.

(ii) If the candidate appears for only one subject in any examination, the gracing is limited to one percent of the maxima of that paper.)

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in Regulation No.4 and subject to Regulation No.3, gracing in any paper or papers in which the candidate is short of the maximum prescribed, shall be three percent of the maximum marks of that paper or papers, if the candidate has taken all the papers prescribed for the examination and has secured 50 percent or more in the total aggregate of that examination.

(Explanation: If the maximum marks for a particular examination is 1000, for which 10 marks are available for gracing, as per regulation No.3, the candidate can avail three percent gracing in any subject/s provided he has secured 500 marks or more out of 1000 in the aggregate of all the papers he has appeared)

the regulations of the courses of study prescribed a separate minima for pass in the aggregate of the marks of the papers, the aggregate of the marks of the paper of the examination can be graced by one percent of the total marks of the papers taken by the candidate.

(Explanation: If in any examination, the subject prescribed has components viz., theory, viva and internal assessment marks in which the theory component has a certain minima for pass and also the aggregate, in such cases aggregate gracing can be done provided the candidate has passed in the theory component by securing minima required).

(NOTE: No candidate shall have the benefit of gracing for the paper/s and the aggregate of the same examination).

7. Whenever gracing is give to a paper or papers, the marks added to the paper/s shall be deducted from other papers if available.
8. Gracing shall also be done for the purpose of declaring classes (First class distinction, First Class and also Second Class) on the following guidelines.
 - (a) For an examination with a maximum of 500 marks or less, there shall be a gracing of ONE MARK.
 - (b) If the maximum marks prescribed for an examination is more than 500 marks, every unit of 500 marks or a part thereof shall be graced by ONE MARK. However, such grace marks shall not exceed three in all.
9. Any fraction of a mark in gracing calculations shall be rounded off to the next higher integer.
10. However, notwithstanding anything contained in the regulation governing the gracing at the examination conducted by the University, grace marks upto five may be awarded at the M.B.B.S/B.D.S. examination for student who



has failed in one subject but passed in all the subjects.
Further subject to regulation 3 of the above will have to be
made applicable.

These Regulations will come into effect for all the ensuing
examinations of Kuvempu University.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING CONDONATION OF SHORTAGE OF ATTENDANCE**1. TITLE:**

These regulations are called as the Regulations governing the "Condonation of shortage of Attendance" in respect of students studying in various Under-Graduate, Post-Graduate Diploma and Post-Graduate Degree Courses in Arts, Science, Commerce, Law, Education, Engineering and Medical Faculties, offered by Kuvempu University.

2. APPLICABILITY:

This regulation is applicable to those who are pursuing education in Under-Graduate, Post-Graduate Diploma and Post-Graduate Degree courses offered in the University.

This regulation shall come into force from the academic year 1997-98.

3. ACADEMIC YEAR:

The Academic year of any of the above mentioned courses shall be as notified by the University.

4. ATTENDANCE:

A candidate shall be considered to have satisfied the requirement of attendance in any particular academic year if he/she attends not less than 75% of the number of classes actually held during the academic year in each of the subjects.

5. CHANGE OF SUBJECT:

a) Whenever a change in a subject is permitted in the middle of the first year/semester the attendance in the changed subject shall be calculated from the date of change. However, while calculating the attendance for the whole year/semester the attendance in the previous subject offered by the candidate shall also be taken into account.

b) Option to change the subject is exercisable only once during the first year/semester of the course.



6. CONDONATION OF ATTENDANCE:

a) In the courses where the minimum attendance requirement is 75% of the classes scheduled to be held, the shortage of attendance for the candidates who have more than 60% but less than 75% of attendance may be condoned by the Vice-Chancellor on the specific recommendation of the Principal/Chairman of Department of Studies and on the payment of condonation fee as prescribed by the University from time to time.

b) As per the regulations of the respective courses the candidates are required to fulfil minimum percentage of attendance in the following professional courses and there is no provision for condonation of attendance, except in M.B.A. course.

REGULATIONS TO ENABLE THE STUDENTS TO PARTICIPATE
IN THE ADULT LITERACY PROGRAMME

PREAMBLE:

During the past fifty years country has been struggling hard to achieve the lofty ideals enshrined in the Constitution and the objectives stipulated in its various policy documents and Programmes. Compulsory primary education and education to girl child constitute one of the areas where the country has failed with lethal consequences. Today there are large masses of people who are deprived of any tangible benefits of education system. This is very clearly reflected in the literacy figure which stands at 52 percent. In the case of female literacy the figure is as low as only 40 percent.

This low literacy levels has now become the crux of the nation's problems, be it economic (Poverty levels), political (corruption) or even social problem. And the only way to overcome this basic problem is to convert the other 48 percent of the population into literates, if not educated. And this is a stupendous task. Government and the Voluntary Agencies are doing their best. But the young student force in the Universities can contribute significantly into this national endeavour.

U.G.C. has come out with a workable Guidelines for Department/Centre for Adult, Continuing Education, Extension work and field Outreach during the Ninth Plan Period. Kuvempu University intends to provide an opportunity to each one of its 35,000 plus students to make his/her contribution atleast in one area, and that is Adult Literacy. And this contribution will also be rewarding to the participant students. The following Regulations, provide for such mutually beneficial programme of Nation building.



PARTICIPATION IN ADULT LITERACY:

1. In addition to the subjects prescribed for the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Courses the students shall participate in Adult Literacy Programme.
2. Each student shall undertake the responsibility of making a minimum of Two and a maximum of Five illiterates per year as literates. The beneficiaries of this literacy programme can be identified by the student himself/herself, at the beginning of his/her course and the same should be recorded in the College.
3. The evaluation of the performance of the student shall be on the guidelines obtained from the Department of Adult Education of Karnataka Government.
4. The student shall be awarded 05 marks per beneficiary for the successful performance in Adult Literacy Programme i.e., a candidate can get a maximum of 25 marks per year and it shall be entered in the marks card.
5. The marks scored for Adult Literacy Work shall be counted for determining the merit in the P.G. Admissions. However, the marks scored by the candidate under this scheme does not count for Ranking in the respective degree.

1. TITLE:

This Regulation shall be called the "Kuvempu University Regulation governing the Bachelor of Commerce Degree Course 2000"

2. COMMENCEMENT:

It shall come into force from the date on which it is assented to by the Chancellor.

3. DEFINITION:

- a) "University" means Kuvempu University.
- b) "Student" means Student admitted to B.Com. Degree under this Regulation.
- c) "Fee" means fee as prescribed by University under this Regulation.
- d) "AC" means AC of Kuvempu University.

4. ELIGIBILITY:

- a) A candidate who has passed the two year Pre-university Examination conducted by the Pre-University Board or JOC conducted by State Council of Vocational Education or any other examination considered as equivalent thereto by this University shall be eligible to seek admission to the First year of this Course.
- b) Candidates who pass the three year Diploma in Commercial or Secretarial Practice or Modern Office Practice conducted by the Department of Technical Education, Government of Karnataka, shall be eligible for the admission to the Second year B.Com., directly without the benefit of exemption in any subject(s) of the Second and Third Year B.Com.
- c) A candidate who has pass the Two year Diploma in Business Administration conducted by the Department of Technical Education, Government of Karnataka, shall be eligible for admission to Third year B.Com., directly. However, the candidate has to pass the First year and also Second year language papers.

DURATION OF THE COURSE:

The Course of study for the B.Com. Degree Examination shall extend over a period of three academic years. Provided that the candidate shall complete his/her Degree within Six years from the date of admission to First year B.Com.

MEDIUM:

The Medium of instruction and examination shall be either Kannada or English.

a) Each year shall be treated as a unit for the purpose of calculating attendance.

b) A student shall be considered to have satisfied the requirement of attendance for the year, if he/she has attended not less than 75% of the number of classes including tutotials, test, etc., actually held up to the end of academic year.

c) However, in case of student who does not secure atleast 75% attendance but gets not less than 60% the deficiency upto 15% may be condoned by the Vice-Chancellor on payment of such fees as may be prescribed by the University from time to time, on the specific recommendation made by the Principal.

d) A candidate who does not satisfy the requirements of attendance even in one subject shall not be permitted to take the whole Examination of that year and he/she shall be repeat the Course in the subsequent year. However permission granted beyond six years.

8. CHANGE OF SUBJECT:

a) A change of subject is permitted by the University, if the requisition of the candidate is received within 30 days from the date of commencement of the classes on the specific recommendation of the Principal.

b) Change of subject shall be approved by the University on such terms and conditions as it may deem fit. Option to change the subject is exercisable only once during the course.

c) Whenever a change in subject is permitted during the academic year, the attendance in that particular subject shall be calculated from the date of change of subject. However, while calculating the attendance for the whole year, the attendance in the previous subject studied by the candidate shall also be taken in to account.

9. ADMISSION OF STUDENTS OF OTHER UNIVERSITIES:

a) Candidates migrating from other Universities may be permitted to join the Second or Third Year of the Degree Classes, provided the candidates produces the Migration Certificate from the concerned University.

b) The candidates who have not successfully completed all the papers of first year or second year examination as the case may be, shall take and pass examinations in his parent University or he/she shall take and pass all the subjects of first or second year of this University as the case may be.

c) The candidates who intend to retain the results of the examination of the University studied previously shall be permitted to do so, subject to the condition that they are not eligible for any Rank or Class in this University Examination.

d) The candidate seeking admission to second year or third year shall be eligible for admission if he/she fulfils the requirements of eligibility for promotion to the next higher class in accordance with the Regulation of this University.

10. COURSE STRUCTURE:

A) The student of B.Com. Degree Course shall study the following subjects as prescribed by the the Academic Council of the University or other subjects and Course contents as may be prescribed by the Academic Council of the University from time to time.

B) If a candidate opts 'Computer Applications' as one of the two elective groups, then the candidate shall have to study 'Entrepreneurial development' as an alternative paper for compulsory paper of 'Computer Applications' in the Third year B.Com. Degree Course.

C) ELECTIVE GROUPS:

1) Each elective group shall consists of three papers spread over three years - one paper each year;

2) The candidate shall select any two Elective groups, out of six electives, in addition to the compulsory papers. And all the papers in those Groups being compulsory.

Elective Group-I : ACCOUNTING

- I - Cost Accounting
- II - Corporate Accounting
- III - Management Accounting

Elective Group-II : BUSINESS MANAGEMENT

- I - Office Management
- II - Company law and Management
- III - Principles of Management

Elective Group-III : BANKING

- I - Banking Theory
- II - Indian Banking
- III - International Banking

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Elective Group-IV : MARKETING

- I - Marketing Management
- II - Sales Management
- III - Advertisement

Elective Group-V : TAXATION

- I - Indian Tax System & Direct Taxes-I
- II - Direct Taxes-II
- III - Indirect Taxes

Elective Group-VI : COMPUTER APPLICATIONS

- I - Fundamentals of Computer Technology
- II - Business Data Processing
- III - Data Base Management

D) The student who has opted UGC Vocational Course on 'Computer Applications' has to select any two elective groups except "Elective Group-VI:COMPUTER APPLICATIONS".

The student who has opted UGC Vocational Course on 'Advertising, Sales Promotion and Sales Management' has to select any two elective groups except "Elective Group-IV:MARKETING".

In the same way, the student who has opted UGC Vocational Course on 'Tax Planning and Procedure' has to select any two elective groups except "Elective Group-V:TAXATION".

E) SKILL DEVELOPMENT:

- a) Each student shall maintain 'Skill Development Record'.
- b) Out of the total marks for skill development, five marks are for record maintenance and 20 marks for external examination.
- c) Skill development examination shall have to be conducted in each college by the external examiner to be appointed by the University along with one internal examiner (Whose name figures in the gradation list and is appointed by the Principal in consultation with Head of the Department of Commerce) for each batch of 20 students or part thereof. The duration for skill development examination shall have to be for one hour for each paper.

F) Two languages shall be offered under Group I of First and Second year B.Com. and atleast one of the languages selected by the student shall be an Indian language such as Kannada, Hindi, Sanskrit, Urdu, Tamil, Telugu, Malayalam, etc. However,

case of foreign nationals the requirements of an Indian language may be waived by the University.



G) Candidates shall be offered the same two languages for the Degree of B.Com. which she/he has studied for the Pre-University Course. However, a student may opt for Kannada even if he/she has not studied it at Pre-University level.

h) The University may permit private study of a language by a student if there is no provision for instruction of that subject in a college and allow him/her to appear for the examination in that subject without insisting on attendance.

11. ELIGIBILITY TO TEACH THE PAPERS:

a) All the papers, except languages, shall be taught by the teachers possessing at least M.Com. Degree OR M.B.A. Degree (with B.Com. or B.B.M. as basic Degrees).

b) However, "Managerial Economics" paper of First year B.Com. shall be taught by the teachers possessing either M.Com. Degree or M.A. (Economics) Degree.

c) "Quantitative Techniques and Business Applications" paper of Third year B.Com. shall be taught by the teachers possessing either M.Com. Degree or M.Sc. (Mathematics) Degree.

d) "Computer Applications" paper/s shall be taught by the teachers possessing either M.Com. Degree with computer training or B.E./M.E. (Computer Engineering) Degree.

12. QUESTION PAPER SETTING AND EVALUATION:

All the papers of B.Com. Degree Course, except languages, shall be under the Board of Examiners in Commerce (Graduates) for examination purposes.

13. PROMOTION TO THE NEXT HIGHER CLASS:

a) A student admitted to First year B.Com. Course shall be promoted to Second year only after his/her passing all the papers of the First year B.Com., Degree Course.

b) For admission to Third year B.Com., Degree Course, a student has to pass all the papers of the First year B.Com., and Second year B.Com., Degree Course.

14. APPEARANCE FOR THE EXAMINATION:

A Candidate shall apply for all the subjects of a year when he/she appears for the examination of that year for the first time.

15. MINIMA FOR A PASS:

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a) Paper minimum for pass is 23 marks in theory and 8 marks in Skill Development. However, no candidate shall be declared to have not less than 35 percent of the marks in each of the subjects.

b) A candidate obtaining not less than 35 percent marks in any of the subject shall be declared to have passed in that subject/s. Such a candidate is permitted to take the examination in the failed subject/s at a subsequent examination and he/she must secure not less than 35 percent of marks for a pass in the subject.

c) The result of successful candidate at the final examination shall be declared as NCL if he/she has not successfully completed in lower examinations.

d) No class shall be declared for the First and Second year under Group-II examination. For declaring the class of Group I at the end of Second year, marks obtained by the candidate at the First and Second year B.Com. examinations shall be taken into account.

16. CLASSIFICATION OF SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES:

The declaration of class for the B.Com. Degree Course shall be on the basis of total marks obtained by the candidates in the Course subjects (i.e. Commerce subjects) of the First, Second and Third year B.Com. Degree Course examinations in first attempt.

First Class: Those who obtain not less than 60 percent of the aggregate marks in the Commerce subjects of First, Second and Third year B.Com. Degree Examination.

Second Class: Those who obtain less than 60 percent but not less than 50 percent of the aggregate marks in the Commerce subjects of First, Second and Third year B.Com. Degree Examination.

Third Class: Those who obtain less than 50 percent but not less than 35 percent of the aggregate marks in the Commerce subjects of First, Second and Third year B.Com. Degree Examination.

17. REJECTION OF RESULTS:

a) The candidate shall be permitted to reject the result of the whole examination within such time as may be prescribed by the University from time to time. Rejection of paperwise/subjectwise shall not be permitted. This rejection shall be exercised only once in each year and the rejection once exercised cannot be revoked.

b) The candidate shall apply for rejection of results through the College of study in the prescribed form alongwith the original statement of marks by paying such fee as may be prescribed by the University from time to time.

18. REPEAL AND SAVINGS:

Notwithstanding anything contained above, provisions of any Statute, Regulations, Orders or Rules in force shall be inapplicable to the extent of inconsistency with this Regulation. The University shall issue such Orders, Instructions, Procedures and prescribe such format as it may deem fit to implement the provisions of this Regulation. The decision of the Vice-chancellor in all matters shall be final.

KUVEMPU UNIVERSITY

REGULATION GOVERNING THE BACHELOR OF FINE ARTS DEGREE COURSE FRAMED UNDER SECTION 44(1) OF K.S.U.ACT-2000.

(The assent of His Excellency, the Chancellor dated 05-03-2003, has been communicated by the Principal Secretary, Education Department vide letter No. ED 2 USS 2002 Dated 01-04-2003)

I. SHORT TITLE & COMMENCEMENT:

- a. This regulation shall be called the Kuvempu University "Regulation Governing the Bachelor of fine Arts Degree."
- b. This shall come into force from the academic year 2002-2003.

II. ELIGIBILITY:

- A Candidate for being eligible for admission to the first year Foundation course leading to Bachelor of Fine Arts in painting/applied Art/sculpture/graphic art.
 1. must have passed the S.S.L.C. Examination, conducted by the Secondary School Examination Board, Karnataka State, or an examination of any other State or body recognised as equivalent to the Secondary School Leaving Certificate Examination:
 2. Should pass aptitude/entrance test conducted by the College concerned.

A Candidate for being eligible for admission to the III year BFA (specialisation course) in Bachelor of Fine Arts, must have passed the I Year BFA Foundation Examination in Fine Arts of the College conducted by Kuvempu University or two years preparatory course conducted by the Karnataka Secondary Education examination Board/University recognised, as equivalent to that examination.
 3. A Weightage of 05 marks will be given to the candidates who have passed the Higher Drawing Grade/Drawing Master Certificate (D.M.C) Examination Conducted by Secondary Education Examination Board in Karnataka or its equivalent.
 4. The candidates who are permitted to seek admission to a particular degree course (Specialisation branch) on transfer from the other Universities/bodies, which are equivalent to the Kuvempu University and which follow the same pattern, are eligible to join the BFA degree course. However, they have to produce a migration certificate, certificate of passing of previous examinations, character certificate etc.

III. CONDUCT OF APTITUDE TEST:

The candidates who satisfy the minimum qualification prescribed shall be called for an Aptitude Test by the college/Institution on the dates notified by the Head of the Institution for selection of eligible candidates for admission to the First Year Foundation Course of the B.F.A. Degree.

The test shall consist of the following:

2. Design & Colour	50	03 Hours
Total	<u>100 Marks</u>	

NOTE: The minimum marks to pass in the Test is 50% in aggregate of subject 1 And 2 above.

IV. **THE INTAKE:** The Intake for First Year Foundation Course shall be 50 seats or as fixed by the University from time to time. The norms of reservation laid down by the Government/University shall be followed in the admissions.

V. **Eligibility requirements for admission to the specialised course of the first year BFA Degree Course.**

Such of those students who have passed the first Year Foundation Examination of the B.F.A. DEGREE Course of have secured a qualification of any other recognised Institution/University considered as equivalent to the Two Years Foundation Course of the University shall be considered eligible for admission to the III Year B.F.A. Degree Course. (1 year of Specialization)

VI. **Preference in the matter of admission to the III year BFA Degree Course(I Yr. Specialisation)**

The admission of students shall be limited to the number of seats allocated in each discipline and shall be done on the basis of merit in the following disciplines with a provision of additional of intake for the repeaters.

VII. **Duration of the Course: Five years.**

The Five Year B.F.A. Degree Course consists of:

- (i) A Foundation Course of Two Years duration
And
- (ii) A Specialisation Course of Three Years duration leading to B.F.A. degree in any one of the Four Disciplines/Courses offered.

VIII. Academic Term:

As per the calendar of Events announced by the University.

IX. Medium of Instruction:

Theory - English/Kannada
Practical - English/Kannada

X. Attendance:

- a) each academic year shall be taken into consideration for the purpose of calculating attendance.
- b) Students should attend studio practicals and lecture classes as well as seminars, if any, and workshop conducted by the faculty during each academic year as prescribed and not absent themselves from work without adequate reasons.
- c) A Student shall be considered to have completed an academic year if he/she has attended not less than 75% of the number of working periods comprising the course during the said academic year and if, his/her conduct and progress have been satisfactory.
- d) The Students who do not satisfy the requirements of attendance as mentioned above, shall not be recommended by the faculty to appear for the University examinations.

XI. COURSE OF STUDY:


Any two language allowed by the University out of which one language shall be an Indian language. This can be relaxed by the Vice-Chancellor in case of foreign nationals.

XII. HOURS OF INSTRUCTION: TUITION PER YEAR:

Particulars regarding the subjects, duration, No. of working hours, internal marks, examination marks, minimum-maximum marks, hours of public examination of each paper(in days) shall be as mentioned in the scheme of examination.

XIII. APPEARANCE FOR THE EXAMINATION:

- a) A Candidate will be allotted seat for III BFA course (I Yr. specialisation) on merit cum option.
- b) A candidate shall apply for all the parts in each examination when he/she appears for the first time. A candidate shall be considered to have appeared for the examination only if he/she submitted required tutorials/ assignments, mentioned in the progress card. A Candidate shall submit the prescribed application for the examination along with the required fees.

- 
- c) A Candidate who has passed the two years P.U.C. or any degree course is exempted from the study of languages in the I & II Year of Foundation course.
- d) To declare the results in such cases the marks should be carried over from the statement of marks of P.U.C/Degree as the case may be.
- e) All the examinations from First and Second year of the Foundation course and that of First yr. Second Yr. And 3rd yr. of specialization shall be conducted by the University.

XIV. Minimum for a pass:

The Candidates who have obtained atleast 35% of marks in theory papers and 40% aggregate in theory and practicals, both in internal assessment and Examinations, shall be eligible for a pass or exemption in that paper/subject.

XV. Conditions under which candidates are permitted to keep term:

- a) A Candidate who has failed in one subject in practicals and one in theory and has passed in all other subjects in I B.F.A.(Foundation) shall be allowed to keep terms and appear for II BFA (Foundation) examination.
- b) A Candidate will not be declared to have passed the II BFA (Foundation) unless he/she has passed the remaining subjects of the I BFA (Foundation)
- c) Unless the Candidates have successfully passed the I year BFA (Foundation) they are not eligible to join the BFA specialisation Course (Painting, Sculpture, applied art, graphic art).
- d) **Specialisation:**
Candidates who have passed in all the practicals and failed in two of the theory subjects in III B.F.A.(I year Specialisation) shall be allowed to keep terms and appear for IV B.F.A. (II yr. Specialisation).

Also candidates who have failed in one practical and in one theory subject in III B.F.A. (I year. Specialisation) shall be allowed to keep terms and appear for IV B.F.A. (II year specialisation).

Similarly, the candidates who have either failed in two of the theory subjects or one practical and one theory subject and have passed in other subjects in IV B.F.A. (II year specialisation) shall be allowed to keep terms and appear for V B.F.A. (III year specialisation).

Unless the Candidate has successfully passed the III B.F.A. (I year specialisation) he/she will not be eligible for joining the V B.F.A. (III year specialisation). Till the Candidate successfully passes the IV B.F.A. (II Year specialisation), the result of V B.F.A. (III Year specialisation) will be withheld.

XVI. Classification of successful Candidates:

The results of the I BFA & II BFA (I & II Year of Foundation) & III, IV, V BFA of Specialisation examinations shall be declared and classified as follows:

- (a) **Distinctions:** Those who obtain 70% and above of the total marks in I & II Year Foundation & for specialisation courses III, IV & V BFA.
- (b) **First Class:** Those who obtain 60% and above but less than 70% of total marks of in I & II year BFA (Foundation) and for specialisation course III, IV & V BFA.
- (c) **Second Class:** Those who obtain 50% and above, but less than 60% of the total marks in I & II year BFA (Foundation) & for III, IV & V BFA specialisation courses.
- (d) **Pass Class:** Rest of the successful candidates who secure 40% of aggregate and above but less than 50% of marks in I & II BFA (Foundation) and for III, IV & V BFA specialisation courses.
- (e) **Ranks:** Classes and ranks shall be declared on the basis of the aggregate marks obtained by the Candidates in I & II year Foundation and II, IV & V BFA (Specialisations). However, only those candidates who have passed each annual public examination in the first attempt only shall be eligible for the award of ranks.

XVII. Rejection of results:

The Candidates shall be permitted to reject the result of the whole examination of any year within 30 days after the publication of the results. This rejection shall be exercised only once and the rejection once exercised shall not be revoked. The application for rejection of results shall be submitted to the Controller of Examinations/ Registrar (Evaluation) along with the prescribed fee.

XVIII. Provision & Rules for Ex. Candidates:

A Student who has failed to get aggregate 40% or failed in one or more subjects can re-appear for the annual Examination and need not attend the classes, provided he/she has the required attendance during the original course of studies.

XIX. Removal of difficulties at the commencement of these regulations:

If any difficulty arises while giving effect to the provisions of these regulations, the Vice-Chancellor may, in extraordinary circumstances, pass such orders as he may deem fit, in consultation with the committee of the Academic Council, if need be.

XX. Rules regarding concession of fees, etc., will be according to University rules.

Regulations Governing Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) Degree Course framed under section 44 of KSU Act 2000

1. TITLE

These Regulations shall be called "Kuvempu University Regulations governing Bachelor of Computer Application Degree Course".

2. COMMENCEMENT

It shall come into force from the Academic Year 2002-03.

3. INTAKE

Maximum intake in a college shall be 60. However, the Vice-Chancellor is empowered to increase or reduce the intake if the circumstances so warrant in the interest of students, with the concurrence of the academic council.

4. STRUCTURE OF THE COURSE

4.1 The course shall be of three years duration spread over six semesters provided that the candidate shall complete his/her degree within six years from the date of admission to 1st semester of B.C.A. First and Second semesters shall have six theory papers and one lab related to Computer Application. The sixth semester shall have three theory papers, a project and seminar. The remaining semesters shall have five theory papers and two labs. However, the structure can be amended by following the procedure laid down under K.S.U.Act-2000 and after the approval of Academic Council.

4.2 Each semester shall be minimum of sixteen weeks duration with four hours of teaching per week for each theory paper and three hours for each lab.

4.3 The odd semesters would commence during June-July and even semesters during November-December, during each academic year.

4.4 Students shall not be allowed to carry over more than, four subjects before getting admission to the third semester and eight subjects before getting admission to fifth semester. There shall be no such restriction for moving from odd to even semesters.

5. ADMISSION

5.1) The candidates who have secured the minimum of 40% marks in aggregate in PUC II or 10+2 of the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) or in an equivalent examination with any of the Science subjects, Electronics, Computer Application or Commerce are eligible to apply for this course. The minimum percentage shall be 35 in respect of SC/ST candidates.

5.2 The candidates who have passed JOC (vocation course) in Computer Application or Diplomas in Electronics & Computer Application are also eligible to join this course.

5.3 The candidates shall be selected by conducting an Entrance Test and/or Interview by the respective Institutions.



6. ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS

- 6.1 Each semester is considered as a unit and each candidate should attend atleast 75% of theory and practical classes.
- 6.2 The candidates who have less than 75 % of attendance in each subject shall have to repeat the whole semester and such candidates shall not be permitted to take admission to the next semester.

7. ELIGIBILITY FOR PASSING

- 7.1 For a pass in a subject, a candidate shall secure a minimum of 35% of the marks prescribed for a subject in the University examination (Theory, Practical) and 40% of marks in aggregate inclusive of the internal assessment marks, both for theory and practical, project work and viva voce.
- 7.2 The candidates who do not satisfy the condition 7.1 shall be deemed to have failed and have to reappear for the University examination in the subsequent examination to pass it. However, there shall be no change in the internal assessment marks awarded to the candidates.
- 7.3 The candidates who do not get the prescribed passing marks as per 7.1 in all the subjects of a semester but pass in one or more subjects with 40% or more marks, shall be exempted from appearing for those subjects
- 7.4 If a candidate so desires, he/she may reject his/her results.
- 7.5 The candidates exercising option under clause 7.4 shall have to reject all the subjects of the concerned semester irrespective of whether he/she has passed or failed in any subject, and that he/she shall not be allowed to reject individual subjects or part thereof.
- 7.6 Subsequent to the rejection of the result, the candidates shall seek re-admission at ODD semester only. However, the permission may be accorded by the Vice-Chancellor for re-admission to even semester in specific cases, if the circumstances so demand subject to the recommendations by the concerned Principal.
- 7.7 Such candidates who opt for rejection at final year are eligible for award of class and distinction at the BCA degree level, but are not eligible for award of ranks.
- 7.8 Application for such rejection shall be sent to the Registrar (Evaluation) through the Principal of the college within thirty days from the date of announcement of results.
- 7.9 A candidate shall not be declared to have completed the course of BCA degree unless he/she has undergone the tuition in all the SIX semesters.

8. AWARD OF RANK

A candidate shall be eligible for a rank for the whole course, provided he/she has passed in all the subjects of all the semesters in first attempt only. The no. of ranks announced shall be limited to 10 only.

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9. AWARD OF DEGREE

- 9.1 The degree of "Bachelor in Computer Application" (BCA) shall be awarded to the candidates who have passed in all the examinations from 1st to 6th semesters. However, the class of the degree shall be awarded based on the performance of the candidates in 5th and 6th semesters examinations taken together.
- 9.2 A candidate who secures 70% and above marks in aggregate and passes in all the subjects of 5th and 6th semester shall be declared to be eligible for BCA degree in first class with distinction.
- 9.3 A candidate who secures 60% of marks and above and less than 70% of marks in aggregate and passes in all the subjects of 5th and 6th semester shall be declared to be eligible for BCA degree in first class.
- 9.4 A candidate who secures less than 60% of marks and more than 40% of marks in aggregate and passes in all the subjects of 5th and 6th semesters shall be declared to be eligible for BCA degree in second class.

10. POWER TO REMOVE DIFFICULTIES:

Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations, the Vice-Chancellor in consultation with the Academic Council shall have the power to remove difficulties, if any.



1. TITLE:

These Regulation's shall be called "Kuvempu University Regulation governing Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science & Bachelor of Commerce Degree courses (B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.) (Semester Scheme)".

2. COMMENCEMENT

It shall come in to force from the Academic year 2003-2004.

3. DEFINITION:

- a) "University" means Kuvempu University as specified under section 3(d) of KSU Act, 2000.
- b) "Student" means Students admitted to B.A./B.Sc./B.Com Degree courses.
- c) "Academic Council" means Academic Council of Kuvempu University as specified under section 2(1) read with section 30 of KSU Act, 2000.

4. INTAKE

Intake of students of B.A./B.Sc., & B.Com. shall be fixed by the Syndicate on the recommendation of the LICs. However, the Vice-chancellor in consultation with the Syndicate shall be empowered to increase or reduce the intake, if the circumstances so warrant, in the interest of students.

5. DURATION OF THE COURSE:


The course of study for the B.A/ B.Sc. & B.Com., degree (Semester Scheme) shall be over a period of three academic years, each academic year comprising of two Semesters and each semester comprising of minimum sixteen weeks of class work. However, the candidate shall complete his/her Degree within six years from the date of admission to the first semester of B.A/ B.Sc. & B.Com., Degree course.

6. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION:

The medium of instruction and examination shall be either English or Kannada.

7. ATTENDANCE:

- a) Each semester shall be taken as a unit for the purpose of calculating attendance. Each candidate should attend at least 75% of theory and practical classes.
- b) The candidates who have less than 75% of attendance in each subject shall have to repeat the whole semester and such candidate shall not be permitted to take admission to the next semester.
- c) A student shall be considered to have satisfied the requirements of attendance for the semester, if he/she has attended not less than 75% of the number of classes actually held including tutorials, tests, etc. to the end of the semester in each of the subject/paper.
- d) If a candidate represents his/her institution/University /Karnataka State/ Nation in Sports/NCC/NSS/Cultural or any officially sponsored activities he/she shall be permitted to claim attendance for actual number of days participated subject to a maximum of 20 days in Semester based on the recommendation of the Head of the Institution concerned. This facility shall also be extended to students who absent due to accident/serious illness leading to actual hospitalization. If a candidate is selected to participate in national level events such as Republic Day parade, etc., he/she shall be permitted to claim attendance for actual number of days participated subject to a maximum of 30 days in a semester based on the recommendation of the Head of the Institution concerned.

- a) A candidate who has passed the two year pre university examination (P. conducted by the Pre University Board of Education in the state of Karnataka, or any other Examination considered as equivalent thereto by the university, (such as SSSE/ CBSE) is eligible for admission to the first semester of B.A/B.Sc./B.Com (Semester Scheme) Degree courses. 
- b) The candidates who have passed two year JOC (Vocation Courses) /three year Diploma courses conducted by the Director of Vocational Education/Technical Education Board are also eligible to join B.A., B.Com. course.
- c) The candidate who has passed JOC/Diploma course in the concerned Science subject is eligible to join B.Sc. course, subject to following conditions:
- The candidates seeking admission to first semester B.Sc. in Physical Sciences should have studied Physical Sciences at two year JOC/three year diploma courses.
 - Those who have studied Biological Sciences at two year JOC/three year diploma course, are eligible to get admission for first semester B.Sc. in Biological Sciences only.
- d) In case of foreign nationals seeking admission to above courses, admissions are governed by University Equivalence committee/Association of Indian University Guidelines.
- e) The student who has passed first year or second year of non-semester of this University shall be eligible for admission to third semester or fifth semester subject to the restriction as laid down in the clause No.4 of this regulation.
- f) Candidate who has passed the three year diploma in Commercial or Secretarial Practice, or Modern Office Practice conducted by the dept. of Technical Education, Government of Karnataka shall be eligible for the admission to the second year (third semester) B.Com., directly without the benefit of exemption in subject/s of the second and third year B.Com. (third to sixth semester).
- g) A candidate who has passed the two year diploma in Business Administration conducted by the dept. of Technical Education, Government of Karnataka will be eligible for admission to third year B.Com. (fifth semester) directly. However, the candidate has to pass the first year and second year (first to fourth semester) language papers.

9. SUBJECTS OF STUDY:

- A candidate for B.A/B.Sc. & B.Com. (Semester Scheme) Degree shall select two Languages for study under group I.
- A candidate for B.A/B.Sc. (Semester Scheme) Degree shall select any combination of three subjects for study under group II(a) and II(b) and B.Com. (Semester Scheme) degree shall study topics listed under Group II C or as notified by the University from time to time.

GROUP – I: Languages (common to B.A/B.Sc./B.Com. Degree)

Kannada, English, Sanskrit, Hindi, Urdu, Telugu, Tamil, Persian, Arabic, Malayalam, French, German.

Note:

1. Languages selected under group I shall be at least one of the Indian Languages. In case of foreign nationals, the requirement of the Indian language may be waived by the University.
2. Indian language means any one of the languages mentioned above, and included in the 8th schedule of the Constitution of India.
3. The University may permit private study of language by a student if there is no provision for instruction in that subject in a college and allow him to appear for the examination in the subject without insisting on attendance.

GROUP – II: Optionals

a) Arts Subjects: (any three subject)

Kannada, English, Sanskrit, Hindi, Urdu, Persian, Arabic, Tamil, Telugu, Malayalam, French, German.

History, Economics, Political Science, Public Administration, Philosophy, Psychology, Sociology, Social work, Criminology, Ancient History and Archaeology, Linguistics, Music, Journalism, Geography, Anthropology, Education, Military Science, Office Management & Secretarial Practice, Co-operation, Rural Reconstruction and Village Development, Home Science & Computer Application.

b) Science Subjects: (any three subject)

Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Geology, Zoology, Botany, Statistics, Home Science, Biology, Applied nutrition, Catering (Management of Food Science), Micro-Biology, Bio-Chemistry, Computer Science, Computer application, Industrial Chemistry, Industrial Micro-Biology, Sericulture, Bio-Technology, Seed-Technology, Instrumentation Technology, Electronics.

c) Commerce Subjects: (any four subject)

Financial Accounting, Managerial economics, Human Resource Management, Business Legislation, Business Statistics, Principles & Practice of auditing, Computer Application, Entrepreneurial Development, Quantitative Techniques & Business Applications, Banking Law & Practice, Banking Theory, Marketing, Taxation, Business Economics-Principles, Business Management, Marketing Management, Functional Language, Business Economics-Applications, Business Environment, General Insurance Management, Company Law and Secretarial Practice, Corporate Accounting, Cost Accounting, Income Tax Law and Practice, Financial Services, Business Law, Management Accounting, E-Commerce, Quantitative Techniques-1, Advertisement Management, Marketing Research.

NOTE:

- i) The Indian Constitution and Environmental studies shall be studied as compulsory subjects in all the courses (i.e. B.A., B.Sc., B.Com..) Indian Constitution shall be completed at least before the end of IV semester and Environmental studies shall be completed by the end of II semester. Similarly, any other subjects would be studied as compulsory subject as directed by the Government of India/Government of Karnataka/UGC/Courts.
- ii) Any other subject can also be selected as optional by a candidate Recommended & sanctioned by the UGC as a Vocational Subject.

10. CORRESPONDENCE OF SUBJECTS OFFERED:

Subject to regulation 9,

- i) A candidate for B.A., degree course may select any subject listed under the faculty of Arts.
- ii) A candidate for the B.Sc. degree course shall select the corresponding optional Science subjects which he/she has studied at the qualifying examination with the benefit as provided under :
 - a) A candidate opting Physics or Chemistry in the B.Sc. degree course should have studied Mathematics in addition to Physics/Chemistry at the Pre-University level.
 - b) A candidate taking Botany, Zoology or Microbiology, Biotechnology in the B.Sc., degree course should have studied Botany, Zoology or Biology in the Pre-university course.
 - c) A candidate may be permitted to take Geology or Statistics at the B.Sc. degree course even though he/she has not studied those subjects at the qualifying examination provided he/she has selected at least two Science subjects at the qualifying examination.
 - d) A candidate opting Home Science in the B.Sc. degree course should have studied Chemistry and one of the Biological Science subjects (Biology, Botany, Zoology) at the Pre-university level.
 - e) A candidate who has studied Applied Nutrition or Catering should have studied at least two science subjects at the Pre-university level, provided however, that the Vice-chancellor shall have the power to grant exemption from this clause in special cases in special circumstances.

11. CHANGE OF SUBJECTS:

- a) Change of subject may be permitted by the University if the requisition from the candidate is received within 30 days from the date of commencement of the classes on the specific recommendation of the Principal and subject to the availability of subjects in the Institution.
- b) Change of subject shall be approved by the University on such terms and condition as it may deem fit. Option to change the subject is exercisable only once during the course.
- c) Whenever a change in subject is permitted during the academic year, the attendance in that particular subject shall be calculated from the date of change of subject. However, while calculating the attendance for the whole semester the attendance in the previous subject studied by the candidate shall also be taken into account.
- d) The change of subject is permitted during the first, second and third semester's only. If a student desires to change the subject in the second and third semester he/she should appear and pass the new subject of the previous semesters.

- a) The Students Migrating from other Universities may be permitted to join the second year (third semester) or Third year (fifth semester) of the Degree classes, subject to production of the Migration certificate from the concerned University and obtaining the eligibility from the University.
- b) The students who have not successfully completed all the papers of first year non-semester (or I & II semesters) or II year non-semester (or III & IV semesters) examination, as the case may be, shall take and pass examinations in his/her parent University or he/she shall take and pass all the subjects of first year (I & II semesters) or II year (III & IV semesters) of this University as the case may be.
- c) The candidates who intend to retain the results of the examination of the University studied previously will be permitted to do so, subject to the condition that they are not eligible to any rank or class in this University examination.
- d) The candidate seeking admission to V semester shall be eligible for admission if he/she fulfills the requirements of the eligibility for promotion to the next higher class in accordance with this regulation.
- e) The Student Migrating from other Universities shall also fulfill the conditions and requirements regarding admissions prescribed for the students of Kuvempu University.

13. TRANSFER OF STUDENTS FROM OTHER COLLEGES:

Transfer from one college to other college within the jurisdiction of the University may be permitted provided that both the colleges offer the subjects studied by the candidate, subject to note 3 under regulation 9.

14. ELIGIBILITY FOR PASSING:

- 14.1 For a pass in a subject, a candidate shall score a minimum of 35% of marks excluding internal assessments in each of the theory/practical examination and the candidate should score a minimum of 40% of the marks in aggregate in each semester including internal assessment. There shall be no minimum mark for pass in internal assessment/Project Work/Record Book/Viva-Voce, as the case may be.
- 14.2 There shall be separate exemption for theory and practical examinations. A candidate who fails in practical examination and passes in theory examination shall have to appear for practical examination only and Vice-Versa.
- 14.3 The candidates who do not satisfy the condition 14.1 shall be deemed to have failed and have to reappear for the University examination in the subsequent examinations to pass it. However, there shall be no change in the internal assessment marks awarded to the candidates.
- 14.4 The candidates who do not get the prescribed passing marks as per 14.1 in all the subjects of a semester but pass in one or more subjects with 40% or more marks, shall be exempted from appearing for those subjects.
- 14.5 In subjects where there are only theory papers, minimum of 40% is needed to claim exemption.

Note: For this purpose paper includes theory, practical & skill development.

15. REJECTION OF RESULTS:

- 15.1 A candidate may reject his/her results of fifth or sixth semester only within three days from the date of publication of results.
- 15.2 The candidates exercising option under clause 15.1 shall have to reject all the subjects of the concerned semester irrespective of whether he/she has passed or failed in any subject, and that he/she shall not be allowed to reject individual subjects or part thereof.
- 15.3 Application for such rejection shall be sent to the Registrar (Evaluation) through the Principal of the college within thirty days from the date of announcement of results.
- 15.4 Such candidates who opt for rejection at fifth or sixth semester and subsequently successfully complete the degree are eligible for award of class and distinction at the degree level, but are not eligible for award of ranks.

16. CONDUCT OF INTERNAL ASSESSMENTS (IA):

- 16.1 Each subject shall have 20 internal assessment marks for Arts B.A and B.Sc. Mathematics, for B.Sc. IA marks shall be as follows:
Theory paper -10marks, Practical record-5marks, Viva Voce-5marks,
In the case of B.Com., course, out of the total 20 marks for I.A., 10 marks shall be for skill development record and remaining 10 marks for two tests.
- 16.2 Each candidate shall maintain a separate book (Record Book) for each paper for writing & award of internal marks.
- 16.3 In each paper two tests shall be conducted for award of IA marks and the students are required to write the answers in the Record Books only. Each test shall have maximum internal assessment marks prescribed for that paper. However, the third test may be conducted for students who have absented in earlier test/s or who desire to improve. First test shall be conducted in 8th week and second test in 12th week of the semester. Third test if required, shall be conducted between 12th week and the last working day. The average of marks obtained in best of two tests shall be taken as final marks for internal assessment.
- 16.4 The internal assessment marks awarded to students shall be displayed on the notice board of the college within two weeks from the date of conduct of the test.
- 16.5 A certified copy incorporating corrections if any, shall be sent to the Principal in the College by the teacher concerned.
- 16.6 A consolidated internal assessment marks list in all the papers of a particular semester duly signed by HOD & Principal shall be sent to the University Examination Section by the college before one week from the date of conduct of the semester examination.
- 16.7 The complaints regarding internal assessment, can be received within one week from the date of notification of marks on notice board. There will be a review committee at college level constituted by the Principal and the Principal will look into the grievances of students and redress the same by pronouncing their decision in each case. In case the students are aggrieved even after the decision of the above said committee they can approach the Registrar (Evaluation) of the University through their Principal stating the facts and reasons for redressal of grievances. The decision of the Registrar (Evaluation) shall be final.

- 8 The Record book should be shown to the student after evaluation and collected back, whenever needed and if there are complaints. However, flexibility is granted to the concerned Principal to devise any other transparent mechanism.

17. CONDUCT OF EXAMINATIONS:

There shall be an examination at the end of each semester to be conducted by the University or as decided by the University from time to time after the approval of Academic Council.

18. CONDUCT OF PRACTICAL EXAMINATION:

18.1 Practical examinations in different subjects shall be conducted by the University at the end of even semesters (II, IV & VI semesters). However, the practical examinations in different subjects at the end of odd semesters (I, III and V semesters) shall be conducted by the respective colleges through the Coordinators of Practical Examinations nominated by the University. The marks sheets and answer books of practical examination shall be sent to the Registrar (Evaluation) by the Chief Superintendent of the respective colleges.

18.2 The candidate shall keep a record of experiments done for each semester and it will be evaluated at the end of semester at the practical examination.

18.3 The candidate shall produce the record book for practical examination duly certified by the HOD.

18.4 Practical exams includes viva, record submission, submission of specimens wherever applicable.

19 AWARD OF RANK

A candidate shall be eligible for a rank for the whole course, provided he/she has passed in all the subjects of all the semesters in first attempt only. The number of ranks announced shall be limited to 10% only, subject to a limit of ten ranks.

20 AWARD OF DEGREE

20.1 The degree of "Bachelor of Arts" or "Bachelor of Science" or "Bachelor of Commerce (B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.)" shall be awarded to the candidates who have passed in all the examinations from 1st to 6th semesters. However, the class of the degree shall also be awarded based on the performance of the candidates from 1st to 6th semesters examinations taken together, on the basis of marks obtained in first attempt.

20.2 A candidate who secures 70% and above marks in aggregate and passes in all the subjects of 1st to 6th semester shall be declared to be eligible for B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. degree in first class with distinction.

20.3 A candidate who secures 60% of marks and above but less than 70% of marks in aggregate and passes in all the subjects of 1st to 6th semester shall be declared to be eligible for B.A./B.Sc. /B.Com. degree in first class.

20.4 A candidate who secures less than 60% of marks but more than 50% of marks in aggregate and passes in all the subjects from 1st and 6th semesters shall be declared to be eligible for B.A./B.Sc. /B.Com. degree in second class.

21 PROMOTION TO NEXT HIGHER SEMESTER:



A student admitted to I semester course shall be promoted to the III semester only after his/her passing a minimum of 50% of the papers of I and II semesters put together. For admission to the V semester of the course, a student has to pass all the papers of I and II semesters and at least 50% of the papers of III and IV semester put together.

22 COURSE STRUCTURE:

The course structure, the syllabus and the scheme of B.A./B.Sc. /B.Com. shall be as decided by the concerned BOS and approved by Academic Council from time to time.

23 POWER TO REMOVE DIFFICULTIES:

Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations, the Vice-chancellor in consultation with the Academic Council shall have power to remove difficulties, if any, in exceptional circumstances for the reasons to be recorded.

**REGULATIONS GOVERNING REJECTION OF DEGREE RESULTS
AND IMPROVEMENT OF MASTER'S DEGREE RESULTS - 2003.**

1. TITLE :

**REGULATIONS GOVERNING REJECTION OF DEGREE RESULTS AND
IMPROVEMENT OF MASTER'S DEGREE RESULTS - 2003.**

2. COMMENCEMENT:

This Regulation shall come in to force from Academic year 2003-04

3. DEFINITION:

- a. 'University' means Kuvempu University.
- b. 'Academic Year' means year as may be prescribed by the University.
- c. 'Degree Courses' means B.A., B.Sc., B.Com., B.B.M., B.C.A. LL.B. B.F.A., B.Ed., B.E., B.PEd. and any other course leading to Bachelor's degree.
- d. 'Master's Degree Courses' means M.A., M.Sc., M.Com., M.C.A., M.B.A., M.Ed., M.PEd., LL.M., M.E., M.Tech. and any other course leading to Master's degree.
- e. 'Students' means students admitted to Degree and Master Degree courses, Governed by respective course Regulation.
- f. 'Fee' means fee as prescribed by the University from time to time.
- g. 'Vice Chancellor' means Vice Chancellor of the Kuvempu University.
- h. 'Registrar (Evaluation)' means Registrar (Evaluation) of the Kuvempu University.

1. The Degree students, if they so desire, can Reject their results of final two semesters provided they have passed in all subjects / papers of their previous semesters and the semester results of which they desire to reject. Candidates of annual scheme can Reject results of their final year provided they have passed in all subjects / papers of their entire course.

The candidates of Master's Degree may opt for fresh assessment for the purpose of improving the results of any semester provided they have passed in all subjects / papers of that semester and finally choose the results to their advantage, subject to the provision of the Regulation governing the course.

2. Candidates who desire to Reject or opt for Improvement of their results shall apply through proper channel in the prescribed application form along with the fees for Rejection or Improvement and also the Examination fee as prescribed from time to time by the university to the Registrar (Evaluation).
3. Candidates opting for Rejection or Improvement shall surrender their Provisional Pass Certificate / Original marks cards of the semester / semesters or the year of Rejection or Improvement.



4. Applications for Rejection within 30 days and option for Improvement of results within 15 days shall be made from the date of announcement of the results. Applications submitted beyond stipulated period will be summarily Rejected.
5. Application for Rejection or option for Improvement of results once submitted can not be revoked.
6. There shall be no Rejection or Improvement of results of individual subjects or papers of the semester or year.
7. The option of Rejection or Improvement of results of a semester or a year can be exercised only once.
8. Candidates Rejecting or opting for Improvement shall take the next immediate examination.
9. The Degree students who opt for Rejection of results and fail to appear in the immediate next examination shall be permitted to retain the results Rejected, provided they make an application to the Registrar(Evaluation) in writing stating reasons for the non appearance within 30 days from the date of conclusion of examinations. The decision of the Registrar (Evaluation) in this regard shall be final.
10. Candidates opting for Rejection or Improvement of results shall take all the components of the examination excepting those such as I.A., Records, Submissions, Project work etc., for which minimum to pass is not prescribed and the marks obtained are carried forward.
11. Candidates who complete their course at their last attempt under the regulations of "Double the Course Duration" are not eligible for Rejection or Improvement of their results.
12. Notwithstanding anything contained in any Regulation or Orders or Rules in force those shall be inapplicable to the extent of its inconsistency with this Regulation. The Vice Chancellor shall be competent to issue such Directions, Orders and prescribe such procedure and format he may deem fit to implement this Regulation, in consultation with Academic council.

**REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE BACHELOR OF SCIENCE
(HOSPITALITY SCIENCE) B.Sc. (HS) DEGREE PROGRAMME**

(Framed Under Sec. 44(1)(e) of the KSU Act, 2000)

1. TITLE AND COMMENCEMENT:

- i) These regulations shall be called the regulations governing the Bachelor of Science (Hospitality Science) B.Sc. (HS) Degree Programme.
- ii) These regulations shall come into force from the date of assent of the Chancellor.

2. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION:

A candidate who has passed the two year Pre-University Examination conducted by the Pre-University Education Board in the State of Karnataka or any other examination considered as equivalent thereto by Kuvempu University is eligible for admission to the programme.

3. DURATION OF THE PROGRAMME:

The duration of the programme shall extend over a period of three academic years.

4. MAXIMUM PERIOD FOR COMPLETION OF THE PROGRAMME:

A candidate shall complete the programme within six years from the date of admission. The term completing the programme means passing all the prescribed examinations of the programme to become eligible for the degree. No candidate shall be permitted to appear for the examinations after the prescribed maximum period for completing the programme.

5. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION:

The medium of instruction and examination shall be English.

Constitution of India, Human Rights, and Environment - compulsory paper for First year degree programme.

7. ATTENDANCE:

7.1 A candidate shall be considered to have satisfied the requirements of attendance for the year if he/she attends not less than 75% of the number of classes actually held up to the end of the academic year in each of the subjects (in theory and practical separately in subjects with practicals). However, shortage of attendance of students whose attendance is 60% and above but below 75% may be condoned by the University on payment of condonation fee as prescribed by the University and by following the rules prescribed for condonation.

7.2 A candidate who does not satisfy the requirements of attendance even in one subject shall not be permitted to take the whole examination of that year and he/she shall be required to repeat the entire course in a subsequent year.

8. HOURS OF INSTRUCTION PER WEEK:

- 8.1 Languages : Four hours per week per language.
 8.2 Other subjects : Four hours per week per subject.
 8.3 General Studies: Three hours per week.

9. SCHEME OF EXAMINATION AND INSTRUCTION:

The examination for the programme shall be held at the end of each academic year of the course, ordinarily in April/May. A supplementary examination shall be held in the middle of each academic year, ordinarily in October/November.

10. INTERNAL ASSESSMENT:

10.1 The internal assessment shall be based on tests and assignments. There shall be a minimum of two periodical tests preferably one in each term in each theory paper of a subject in an academic year and the average of the best two awards shall be taken as the final award in that paper. If a candidate is absent for any one of the tests due to genuine and satisfactory reasons such a candidate may be given a retest.

10.2 For practical the internal assessment mark shall be based on the performance in the practical and record books.

10.3 The marks of the internal assessment must be published on the notice board of the concerned college for information of the students.

10.4 The internal assessment marks shall be communicated to the Registrar (Evaluation) atleast 15 days before the commencement of the University Examinations and the Registrar (Evaluation) shall have access to the records of such periodicals tests, assignment, records etc

10.5 There shall not be any marks for internal assessment for General Studies.



11. INDUSTRIAL PRACTICUM:

- 11.1 Each student shall undergo 8 weeks training in a hospitality unit of repute with the concurrence of the college. The students shall undergo the training during vacations, subject to the condition that duration of the training undergone by a student shall not be less than 15 days at a time.
- 11.2 For the Industrial practicum there shall not be any credit in terms of marks.
- 11.3 Every student is required to make comprehensive report/s covering the training period/s which shall be submitted to the college along with a certificate/s of satisfactory completion of the training from the hospitality unit/s where the student has undergone the training and the Principal shall submit the same to the Registrar (Evaluation).
- 11.4 No students shall be awarded the degree unless he/she satisfactorily completes the Industrial Practicum.

12. REGISTRATION FOR THE EXAMINATION:

- 12.1 A candidate shall register for examinations in all the subjects of a year when he appears for the examination of that year for the first time.
- 12.2 A candidate shall not be admitted to the practical examination in the first appearance unless he/she produces the class record book duly certified by the Head of the Department of the college in the concerned subject.
- 12.3 Marks awarded for the class record at the first appearance shall be considered for the subsequent appearances in the subject.

13. MINIMUM FOR A PASS:

- 13.1 No candidate shall be declared to have passed the first year/second year/third year examinations as the case may be unless he/she obtains not less than 40% marks in the University Examinations and 40% in aggregate of University Examination and internal assessment marks put together in each theory paper/practical.
- 13.2 A candidate who fails in any of the subject in any year shall take examination only in the failed paper/practical in a subsequent examination and he/she must obtain the minimum for a pass in that paper/practical as stated above.
- 13.3 The minimum for a pass in General Studies shall be 35%

14. CARRY-OVER PROVISION:

- 14.1 A candidate who fails in the first year examination may be allowed to go to second year and keep term.
- 14.2 A candidate who fails in the second year examination may be allowed to go to the third year provided such a candidate has cleared 50% of the subjects prescribed for the first and second year.



15. **CLASSIFICATION OF SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES:**

- 15.1 No class shall be declared for the examination of first and second years.
- 15.2 Class shall be declared at the end of third year on the basis of aggregate marks obtained from first to third year examinations in a single attempt. The marks obtained in General Studies shall not be considered for this purpose.
- 15.3 Ranks shall be declared only on the basis of aggregate marks obtained by the candidates in all the three years in the first attempt only.
- 15.4 All other successful candidates are eligible only for Pass Class. However, if a candidate rejects his results for improvement of class the examination taken for improvement shall be considered as first attempt.
- 15.5 The results of the candidates who have passed the third year examination but not passed all the examinations of the earlier years shall be announced as NCL. (Not completed the lower examinations). Such candidates shall be eligible for the degree only after completion of all the earlier examinations.

15.6 **PERCENTAGE OF MARKS FOR DECLARING CLASSES:**

Distinction	: Not less than 70% marks in the aggregate.
First Class	: 60% and above but less than 70% of the aggregate marks.
Second Class	: 50% and above but less than 60% of the aggregate marks.
Third Class	: 40% and above but less than 50% of the aggregate marks.
Pass Class	: Successful repeater candidates.

16. **REJECTION OF RESULTS:**

- 16.1 A candidate may be permitted to reject the results of the whole examination of any year except General Studies in the first year. Rejection of marks paper-wise/subject-wise shall not be permitted. However, rejection of results of paper under General Studies shall be optional. A candidate who has rejected the results shall appear for the immediately following examinations.
- 16.2 The rejection shall be exercised only once in respect of each year examination and the rejection once exercised cannot be revoked.
- 16.3 Application for rejection along with the payment of the prescribed fee shall be submitted to the Registrar (Evaluation) through the College of study together with the original statement of marks within 30 days from the date of publication of the result.
- 16.4 A candidate who rejects the result is eligible for only class and not for ranking.

17. **TRANSFER OF ADMISSION:**

Transfer of admission is permissible both for the students of other universities and within the university.

17.1 **Conditions for transfer of admission of students within the University:**

- i) His/ Her transfer admission shall be within the intake permitted to the college.
- ii) Availability of same combination of subjects studied in the previous college.



- iii) Fulfillment of attendance requirements as per the Kuvempu University Regulation at his/her own risk.
- iv) He/ She should complete the programme as per the regulation governing the maximum duration of completing the programme as notified by the University from time to time.

17.2 Conditions for transfer of admission of students of other Universities:

- i) A candidate migrating from any other University may be permitted to join the second/third year of the degree programme provided he/she has passed all the subjects of previous year/years as the case may be. Such candidates must satisfy all other conditions of eligibility stipulated in the regulations of Kuvempu University.
- ii) His/ Her transfer admission shall be within the intake permitted to the college.
- iii) Fulfillment of attendance requirements as per the Kuvempu University Regulation at his/her own risk.
- iv) Transfer admission is permissible only in the beginning of the academic year of Second/ Third year but not later than one month from the commencement of the classes provided he/she has to satisfy the condition under clause (iii) above.
- v) The candidate who are migrating from other Universities are eligible for overall class but not for ranking.
- vi) A candidate migrating from other university shall study privately and pass the compulsory papers in Group III - General Studies, "Constitution of India, Human Rights and Environment" before becoming eligible for the award of an usual degree if he/she has not studied this paper in the previous year/years.
- vii) He/ She should complete the programme as per the regulation governing the maximum duration of completing the programme as notified by the University from time to time.

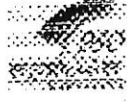

With reference to the above subject, I am directed to convey the approval of

Regulation Governing Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) Degree Course framed under section 44 of KSU Act 2000 (Semester Scheme).

1. TITLE:

These Regulation shall be called Kuvempu University Regulation Governing Bachelor of Social Work Degree course (BSW Semester Scheme).

2. COMMENCEMENT:

It shall come in to force from the Academic year -2006-07.

3. DEFINITION:

- a) "University" means Kuvempu University.
- b) "Student" means Student Admitted to BSW Degree Course.
- c) "Academic Council" means Academic council of Kuvempu University.

4. INTAKE:

Intake of Students of BSW Shall be 60 / 6. However the Vice-Chancellor in Consultation With the Academic Council is empowered to increase or reduce the intake, if the circumstances warrant in the interest of students.

5. DURATION OF THE COURSE:

The course of study for the BSW degree (Semester Scheme) shall be over a period of three academic year, each academic year comprising of two semesters and each semester comprising of sixteen weeks of class work.

Provided that the candidate shall complete his/her Degree with in six years from the date of admission to the first semester of BSW Degree course.

6. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION:

The medium of instruction and examination shall be either in English or Kannada.

7. ATTENDANCE:

- a) Each Semester shall be taken as a unit for the purpose of calculating attendance. Each candidate should attend at least 75% of theory practical/ Field Work/Project Work.

- b) The candidates who have less than 75% of attendance in each subject shall have to repeat the whole semester and such candidate shall not be permitted to take admission to the next semester.
- c) A Student shall be considered to have satisfied the requirements of attendance for the semester, if he/she has attended not less than 75% of the number of classes actually held including tutorials, tests, etc., to the end of the semester in each of the subject/ paper.
- d) If a candidate represents his/her institution/University/Karnataka State/Nation in Sports/ NCC/NSS/Cultural or any officially sponsored activities he/she permitted to avail of actual number of days participated subject to a maximum of 20 days in each Semester based on the recommendation and prior permission of the Head of the Institution concerned. This facility shall also be extended to students who absent due to accident serious illness leading to actual hospitalisation subject to maximum of 20 days.

8. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION:

- a) A candidate who has passed the two year Pre-University Examination (PUC) conducted by the Pre- University Board of Education in the state of Karnataka or any other Examination considered as equivalent thereto by the university. (Such as SSSE/CBSE) is eligible for admission to the first semester of BSW (semester Scheme) Degree course.
- b) The candidate who has passed two year JOC (Vocation Courses)/ three year Diploma courses conducted by the Director of Vocational Education/ Technical Education Board is also eligible to join BSW Course.
- c) In case of Foreign Nationals seeking admission to the above course, admissions are governed by University Equivalence Committee/ Association of Indian University guidelines.

9. SUBJECTS OF STUDY:

- a) A Candidate for BSW (Semester scheme) Degree shall select two Languages for study under Group I.
- b) A Candidate for BSW (Semester scheme) Degree shall study the subjects under the Group II notified by the University.

GROUP-I: Languages (Common to BSW/BA/B Sc Degree)

Kannada, English, Sanskrit, Hindi, Urdu, Telugu, Tamil, Persian, Arabic, Malayalam, French, German.

Note: 1. Languages offered under group- I shall be at least one of the Indian Languages. In case of foreign nationals, the requirement of the Indian Language may be waived by the University.

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2. Indian language means any one of the languages mentioned above, and included in the 8th Schedule of the Constitution of India.

3. The University may permit private study of language by a student if there is no provision for instruction in that subject in a college and allow him to appear for the examination in the subject without insisting on attendance.

- b) Any other Subject recommended and Sanctioned by UGC as a Vocational Subject. A Candidate for BSW Degree course shall study all subjects listed above 9A and 9B Group II.
- c) A Candidate for BSW Degree Course shall Study Constitution of India in First Semester and Environmental science in Second Semester.

10. ADMISSION OF STUDENT OF OTHER UNIVERSITY.

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- a) The Students Migrating from other University may be permitted to join the second year (Third semester) or Third year (Fifth semester) of the Degree classes provided the candidate produces the Migration certificate from the concerned University and to obtain the Eligibility from the University where the student prefers to join.
- b) The Students who have passed all the papers of First and Second Semester shall be admitted to the Third semester. Those who have passed all the papers of Third and Fourth semester shall be admitted to the Vth semester BSW Degree Course.
- c) The candidates who intend to retain the results of the examination of the University studied previously will be permitted to do so, subject to the condition that they are not eligible to any rank or class in this University examination.
- d) The candidate seeking admission to Vth semester will be eligible for admission if he/she fulfill the requirements of the eligibility for promotion to the next higher class in accordance with this regulation.
- e) The Student Migrating from other University shall also fulfill the conditions and requirements regarding admissions prescribed for the students of Kuvempu University.

11. TRANSFER OF STUDENTS FROM OTHER COLLEGES:

Transfer from one college to other college within the jurisdiction of the University May be permitted before the mid-term vacation starts provided that both the colleges offer the subjects studied by the candidate.

12. ELIGIBILITY FOR PASSING:

12.1 For a pass in a subject, a candidate shall score 35% of marks excluding internal assessments in each of the theory/ practical / project work/ Field work. And the candidate should score 40% of the marks in aggregate in each semester including Internal assessment. There is no minimum mark for pass in internal assessment/ Record book.

There shall be a separate exemption for a theory and practical examination. Candidate Who fails in practical examination and passes in theory examination has to appear for Practical examination visa-versa.

12.2 The Candidates who do not satisfy the condition 12.1 shall be deemed to have failed and have to reappear for the University examination in the subsequent examination to pass it. However, there shall be no change in the Internal assessment marks awarded to the Candidates.

12.3 The candidates who do not get the prescribed passing marks as per 12.1 in all the Subjects of a semester but pass in one or more subjects with 40% or more marks shall be exempted from appearing for those subjects.



12.4 If a candidate so desires, may reject his/her result of fifth or sixth semester only within thirty days from the date of publication of results.

12.5 The candidate exercising option under clause 12.4 shall have to reject all the subjects of the concerned semester irrespective of whether he/she has passed or failed in any subject and that he/she shall not be allowed to reject individual subjects or part thereof.

13. REJECTION OF RESULTS:

13.1. If a candidate so desires, he/she may reject his/her result of 5th or 6th semester.

13.2. Application for such rejection shall be sent to the Registrar (Evaluation) through the Principal of the college within thirty days from the date of announcement of results.

13.3 Such candidates who opt for rejection at Fifth or Sixth semester and subsequently successfully complete the degree are eligible for award of class and distinction at the degree level, but are not eligible for award of ranks.

14. CONDUCT OF INTERNAL ASSESSMENTS:

14.1 Each subject shall have internal assessment marks of 20 including Indian constitution.

14.2 For Environmental science there shall be 80 marks for theory and 20 marks for Field works.

14.3 Each candidate shall maintain a record book (Blue Book) for each paper for award of internal marks.

14.4 In each paper two tests shall be conducted and the students are required to answer in the Blue Book only. However, the third test may be conducted for students who have absented in earlier test or who desired to improve. First test shall be conducted in 8th week and 2nd test in twelfth week of the Semester. The third test if required shall be conducted between twelfth week and the last working day. The marks obtained in each paper shall be the average of the best of two tests.

14.5 The internal assessment marks awarded to students shall be displayed on the notice board of the college within one week from the date of conduct of the test.

14.6 A Certified copy incorporating corrections if any shall be sent to the Registrar (Evaluation) by the college within two weeks from the date of conduct of the test.

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14.7 A Consolidated internal assessment marks list in all the papers of a particular semester duly signed by the Principal shall be sent to the University Examination section by the college before one week from the date of conduct of the semester examination.

14.8 The complaints regarding internal assessment can be received within one week from the date of notification of marks on notice board. There will be a review committee at college level constituted by the Principal and the Principal will look into the grievances of students and redress the same by pronouncing their decision in each case. In case of students aggrieved even after the decision of the above said Committee they can approach The Registrar (Evaluation) of the University through their Principal stating the facts and reasons to look into the grievances. The decision of The Registrar (Evaluation) shall be final.

15. CONDUCT OF EXAMINATIONS:

There shall be an examination at the end of each semester to be conducted by the University or as decided by the University from time to time after the approval of Academic Council.

16. AWARD OF RANK:

16.1 A candidate shall be eligible for a rank for the whole course, provided he/she has passed in all subjects of all the semesters in first attempt only. The no of ranks announced shall be limited to 10% only, subject to a limit of Ten ranks.

16.2 A Candidate must have passed BSW Degree in First Class.

17. AWARD OF DEGREE:

17.1 The degree of Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) Shall be awarded to the candidates who have passed in all the examinations from 1st to 6th semester.

However the class of the degree shall also be awarded based on the performance of the candidates from 1st to 6th semesters Examination taken together.

17.2 A candidate who secures 70% and above marks in aggregate and passes in all the subjects of 1st to 6th semester shall be declared to be eligible for BSW degree in first class with distinction.

17.3 A Candidate who secures 60% of marks and above but less than 70% of marks in aggregate and passes in all the subjects of 1st to 6th semester shall be declared to be eligible for BSW degree in first class.

17.4 A Candidate who secures marks 50% and above but less than 60% in aggregate and passes in all the subjects from 1st to 6th semesters shall be declared to be eligible for BSW degree in second class.

17.5 A Candidate who secures less than 50% of marks in aggregate and passes in all the subjects from 1st to 6th semester shall be declared to be eligible for BSW degree in pass class.

18 FIELD WORK:

i) **Field work practicum:** For First to Fourth semesters out of 100 marks, all the 100 marks shall be allotted for internal only.

ii) For Fifth and Sixth semester out 100 marks 50 marks for field work and 50 marks for Viva- Voce which is conducted by both external & internal examiners.

iii) One hour field work class is equivalent to one hour theory class.

19. PROMOTION TO NEXT HIGHER SEMESTER:

19.1 A Student admitted to I semester course shall be promoted to the III semester only after his/her passing a minimum of 50% of the papers of Ist and IInd semesters of course put together.

19.2 For admission to the V semester of Degree course, a student has to pass all the papers of I and II semesters and atleast 50% of the papers of III and IV semester of Degree course put together.

20. COURSE STRUCTURE:

The course structure, the syllabus and the scheme of BSW shall be as decided By the concerned BOS and approved by Academic Council from time to time.

Preamble

Kuvempu University is the first affiliate-type university in the State to offer its Graduate Programmes under Semester Scheme from 2003-04 academic year successfully. However, during this six-year period, it has experienced some practical difficulties and also obtained the feedback from its stakeholders including the student-community which is the major stakeholder group. This necessitated a thorough and comprehensive revision of its Regulations governing the Bachelor of Commerce Degree Programme. Hence, this Regulations.

Draft Regulations governing the Bachelor of Commerce Degree Programme of Kuvempu University under Semester Scheme (Section 44 (1), Karnataka State Universities Act, 2000)

01. Title and Commencement

- 1.1. This Regulations shall be called **Kuvempu University Regulations governing the Bachelor of Commerce Degree Programme under Semester Scheme, 2010-11**, and
- 1.2. This Regulations shall come into force from the date on which it is assented to by the Chancellor.

02. Definitions: In this Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,

- 2.1. **University** means Kuvempu University,
- 2.2. **Bachelor of Commerce Degree** means Graduate Degree Programme in Commerce (B.Com),
- 2.3. **Student** means the student admitted to B.Com Degree Programme under this Regulations,
- 2.4. **Degree** means Bachelor Degree in Commerce,
- 2.5. **Board of Studies** means the Board of Studies in Commerce (Graduate Studies) of Kuvempu University,
- 2.6. **Academic Council** means Academic Council of Kuvempu University,
- 2.7. **Fee** means the fee prescribed by the University for B.Com Programme from time to time, and



- 2.8. **Course** means a logical part of a subject matter of the programme. Alternatively, this shall be called a paper.

03. Eligibility to Apply for Admission

- 3.1. The students who have successfully completed the two-year Pre-university examination (PUC) conducted by the Karnataka Pre-university Board or two-year Job-oriented Course or three-year Diploma Course conducted by the Directorate of Vocational Education/Technical Education Board or any other examination considered as equivalent thereto by this University shall be eligible to apply for admission to the first semester of B.Com Degree Programme,
- 3.2. However, the candidates who have passed the three-year Diploma in Commercial Practice or Secretarial Practice or Modern Office Practice conducted by the Department of Technical Education, Government of Karnataka shall be eligible for admission to the third semester of B.Com programme directly without the benefit of exemption in any course/s of Semesters III – VI, and
- 3.3. Similarly, the candidates who have passed the two-year Diploma in Business Administration (after PUC) conducted by the Department of Technical Education, Government of Karnataka shall be eligible for admission to fifth semester of B.Com programme directly without the benefit of exemption in any Course/s of Semesters – V and VI of B.Com. Further, these candidates shall pass the Language Courses of Semesters I – IV of B.Com Programme by studying on their own.

04. **Admission of Students of other Universities:** The candidate who has completed the first year or first two years of B.Com programme in the institution coming under the jurisdiction of other university shall be eligible to take admission to third semester or fifth semester of B.Com of this University respectively subject to the following conditions.

- 4.1. The candidate should produce the migration certificate from the concerned university,

- 4.2. If the candidate has not successfully completed one or more course/s of Semester/s – I and/or II, or Semester/s – I and/or II and/or III and/or IV of B.Com. as the case may be, shall take and pass the examination.s of this course these courses in his/her parent university. Alternatively, the candidate shall take and pass all the courses of first year (Semesters – I and II) or first and second years (Semesters – I to IV) of this University as the case may be,
- 4.3. The candidate who intends to retain the results of the examinations of the university studied previously shall be eligible to do so subject to the condition that he/she is not eligible for any Rank and Class in this University's examination (Regulations 15.1 and 15.2),
- 4.4. The candidate seeking admission to Semester – III or V of B.Com of this University shall be eligible for admission provided he/she fulfils the requirements of eligibility for promotion to the next higher class (viz., Semester – III or V) in accordance with this Regulations,
- 4.5. Further, the candidate seeking admission to Semester – III or V of B.Com of this University shall be liable to pass (by self-study) those courses of B.Com – I year or B.Com – I and II years of this University if he/she has not studied the same in his/her parent University, and
- 4.6. The candidate who migrates from other university shall also fulfil the conditions and requirements regarding admission prescribed for the students of this Univesity.

05. Duration of the Programme

- 5.1. The Programme of study for B.Com Degree shall normally extend over a period of three academic years, each academic year comprising of two semesters, and each semester comprising of 16 weeks of class work,
- 5.2. No student shall be permitted to obtain B.Com Degree earlier than six semesters or to take more than twelve semesters. That means, the student shall complete the academic programme within six years (but not earlier than three academic years) from the date of admission to the first semester of B.Com Programme, and

- 5.3. Whenever the curricula are revised, and whenever a candidate is reappearing, within the above maximum period (Regulation 5.2), he/she shall be allowed to reappear for the B.Com Degree examination according to the pre-revised curricula (i.e., the curricula in which he/she has studied the Course/s as regular student).

06. Medium of Instruction

- 6.1. The medium of instruction shall normally be English.
- 6.2. However, the students shall be permitted to write their examination even in Kannada, and
- 6.3. In the case of Languages such as Kannada, Hindi, Sanskrit, Urdu, etc, the medium of instruction and examination shall be in the concerned Language.

07. Structure of B.Com Programme

- 7.1. The students of B.Com programme shall study the following courses as prescribed by the Academic Council of the University or other Courses and Course Contents as may be prescribed by the Academic Council of the University from time to time.

- 7.2. Out of the two Languages of Semesters – I to IV of B.Com selected by the students, atleast one shall be an Indian Language such as Kannada, Hindi, Sanskrit, Urdu, Tamil, Telugu, Malayalam, etc. However, in the case of foreign nationals, the requirements of an Indian Language may be waived off by the University.
- 7.3. The student shall be offered the same two Languages for the B.Com programme which he/she has studied at the Pre-university level. However, a student may opt for Kannada even if he/she has not studied it at the Pre-university level,
- 7.4. The University may permit private study of a Language by a student if the number of students opting for that Language is less-than five, and allow him/her to appear for the examination in that Language without insisting on attendance, and
- 7.5. A student who has taken admission to B.Com – V Semester shall select any one of the following as his/her Specialization Stream and both the courses in that Stream being compulsory. Course – I of the Specialization Stream selected by the student shall be studied in B.Com – V Semester and Course – II of the same Specialization Stream shall be studied in B.Com – VI Semester.

- 7.6. A student in B.Com – VI Semester shall have the option either to study “Entrepreneurship Development and Small Business Management” course (Course 606) or to take up Project Work, and prepare and submit the Project Report under the guidance of a Teacher before the commencement of examination of Semester - VI.
- 7.7. The candidate who fails to submit the Project Report shall not be permitted to take the whole examination of B.Com – VI Semester, and
- 7.8. Besides the above Courses (as stated under 7.1 above), the students of B.Com Programme shall be offered the following additional Courses which are mandatory.
- 7.8.1. Environmental Science (it shall be offered either in Semester – I or in Semester – II), and
- 7.8.2. Constitution of India (it shall be offered in any one Semester from Semester – I to Semester – IV).

08. Attendance

- 8.1. Each course shall be taken as a unit for the purpose of calculating the attendance,
- 8.2. A student shall be considered to have satisfied the requirement of attendance for each course, if he/she has attended not less-than 75% of the number of classes held up to the end of the semester including tests, seminars, group discussion, practical, tutorials, special classes and lectures, etc,
- 8.3. However, if a student represents his/her Institution, University, State or Nation in Sports, NCC, NSS or Cultural or any other officially sponsored activities, he/she shall be eligible for the attendance benefit for the actual number of days participated subject to a maximum of 20 days in a semester based on the specific recommendation of the Principal of the Institution concerned. This facility (attendance benefit) shall also be extended to the students who were absent due to accident/serious illness leading to actual hospitalization. In both the cases, the %age of classes attended shall be determined by dividing the number of hours of classes attended (by the student) by the number of hours of classes engaged (excluding the classes held on the days he/she was not present due to hospitalization or participation in sports, etc), and
- 8.4. A student who does not satisfy the requirements of attendance (atleast 75% in each course) shall be ineligible to appear for the examination of that whole semester. And he/she shall repeat that semester as regular student in the next year/s.

09. Change of Subjects

- 9.1. Change of subjects (only in the case of Languages and Specialization Streams) shall be permitted by the University, if the requisition from the student is received within 10 days from the date of commencement of the classes on the specific recommendation of the Principal,

- 9.2. Change of subject shall be approved by the University on such terms and conditions as it may deem fit. Option to change the subjects is exercisable by the student/s only once during the three-year period and
- 9.3. Whenever a change in subject is permitted during a Semester, the attendance in that particular course shall be calculated from the date of change of subject. However, while calculating the attendance for the whole Semester, the attendance in the previous subject studied by the candidate shall also be taken into account.

10. Eligibility to Teach the Courses

- 10.1. All the Courses, except Languages, shall normally be taught by the teachers possessing at M.Com or MBFI or MBA Degree.
- 10.2. However, the Courses "Managerial Economics" (Course 104) and "Money and Public Finance" (Course 204) of B.Com – I and II Semesters respectively shall be taught by the teachers possessing either M.A (Economics) or MBE (Business Economics) or M.Com or MBFI or MBA Degree.
- 10.3. "Business Mathematics" course (Course 206) of B.Com – II Semester, and both the Courses of Specialization Stream, Quantitative Techniques, (Courses 507J1 and 607J2) shall be taught by the teachers possessing either M.Com or MBFI or M.Sc (Mathematics or Statistics) or MBA Degree.
- 10.4. Both the courses of Specialization Stream, "Tourism and Hospitality Management" (Courses 507H1 and 607H2) shall be taught by the teachers possessing M.Com or MBFI or MTA Degree, and
- 10.5. The Courses, "Information Technology – I and II" (Courses 306 and 406) of B.Com – III and IV Semesters respectively and both the Courses of Specialization Stream, E-commerce (Courses 507I1 and 607I2) shall be taught by the teachers possessing M.Com or MBFI or MCA or M.Sc (Computer Science) or M.E (Computer Engineering) or MBA Degree.

11. Continuous Assessment Programmes and Evaluation

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- 11.1. Out of the total marks for each course, 20% shall be earmarked for Continuous Assessment (Internal Assessment) and the remaining 80% for the semester-end examination.
- 11.2. Out of 20 marks for internal assessment, one test shall be conducted, preferably during the third week of third month of the semester (with a provision for re-test, if a student wishes, before the close of semester classes), and the remaining 10 marks shall be earmarked for the Skill Developmental Activities and the Record of these activities,
- 11.3. In the case of Skill Developmental Activities, every student shall attend to atleast five activities in each course (excluding the Course – 508: Logical and Analytical Reasoning of Semester – V, and Course – 608: Personality Development of Semester – VI wherein there are no Skill Developmental Activities) and keep a proper record which shall be the base for awarding marks,
- 11.4. However, in the case of Course – 508: Logical and Analytical Reasoning of Semester – V, and Course – 608: Personality Development of Semester 0 VI, only one test each shall be conducted for 10 marks (without Skill Developmental Activities),
- 11.5. In the case of Project Report, it (Project Report) shall be evaluated for 80 marks and the viva-voce examination shall be conducted by the Departmental Council of the College for the remaining 20 marks,
- 11.6. The marks obtained in the tests and the skill developmental activities shall be displayed on the notice board of the College,
- 11.7. In each of the activities pertaining to the internal assessment marks, complete transparency shall be ensured by the course teacher, and the student who is not satisfied with the marks awarded to him/her can make an appeal to the Head of the Department with justifiable reasons. On the receipt of appeal, the Head of the Department shall convene a meeting of the Departmental Council and redress the grievances of the student appropriately,

- 11.8. In case of candidates who appear for improvement examination, and/or the students who take the examination in the failed course/s. the marks obtained in the internal assessment shall not be revised. There shall be no improvement for internal assessment, and
- 11.9. Student-wise and Course-wise internal assessment marks shall be communicated to the Office of the Registrar (Eval) by the Principal of the College before the commencement of University examination and the University shall have access to the records of continuous assessment for verification, if necessary.
12. **Appearance for the Examination:** A candidate shall apply for all the courses of a Semester when he/she appears for the examination of that Semester for the first time.
13. **Question Paper Setting and Evaluation:** All the Courses, except Languages, of B.Com Degree Programme shall be under the Board of Examiners in Commerce (Graduate Studies) for the purpose of examination – setting of question papers and evaluation of answer scripts.
14. **Evaluation, Revaluation and Minimum Marks for Pass**
- 14.1. Every answer script in the semester-end examination shall be subjected to coded, central and single evaluation,
- 14.2. A candidate shall be declared to have passed the examination if he/she obtains not less-than 40% marks in aggregate in each semester and 35% of the maximum marks including internal assessment marks in each course (including Project Report) provided he/she secures atleast 35% of the maximum marks in each Course in the semester-end examination. However, there shall be no minimum for internal assessment marks,
- 14.3. A candidate obtaining less-than 35% of the maximum marks and/or 35% of marks in the semester-end examination in any course shall be declared to have failed in that course. Such a candidate shall be eligible to take the examination in the failed course/s at a subsequent examination and he/she shall secure not less-than 35% of the maximum marks for pass in that course/s including 35% marks in the semester-end examination,

- 14.4. A student who desires to get his/her answer script/s revalued may do so by submitting an application along with the prescribed fee to the Registrar (Evaluation) within 15 days from the date of announcement of the result. Such answer script/s shall be got valued by another external examiner. The marks awarded to that answer script/s shall be the average of two marks. However, if the difference in the marks between the two evaluations exceeds 15%, the script shall be referred to the third internal evaluation. In this type of situation, the marks awarded to that script shall be the average of the two nearer marks out of the three evaluations,
- 14.5. However, in the case of Project Report, there shall be double evaluation – one by the concerned guide at the college level and another by one of the examiners from the panel of examiners. The chairman of BoE in Commerce (Graduate Studies) shall arrange for the second evaluation of the Project Reports in the concerned college by deputing the external examiners (i.e., the examiners from other colleges with the University jurisdiction) to the college,
- 14.6. The Principal of the College shall submit the marks list of both the examiners, after the evaluations, to the Office of the Registrar (Eval) before the completion of B.Com – VI Semester examination. If the difference in the marks between the two evaluations exceeds 15% of the maximum marks, then such a report shall be referred to the third examiner. And in this type of situation, the marks to be awarded to the project report shall be the average of the nearer two out of three evaluations,
- 14.7. The candidate shall obtain a minimum of 35 marks in the Project Report failing which he/she shall revise and resubmit the Project Report before the commencement of the next examination. However, no candidate shall be allowed to resubmit the Project Report after three consecutive chances,
- 14.8. The result of the successful candidate at B.Com – VI Semester examination shall be declared as NCL (not completed lower examination) if he/she has not successfully completed the lower examination, and

14.9. The Degree of Bachelor of Commerce shall be awarded to the candidates who have passed all the courses of Semesters – I to VI Semesters of B.Com.

15. Promotion to Next Higher Semester

15.1. For admission to B.Com – III Semester, a student shall pass atleast 40% of the Courses of B.Com – I and II Semesters put together subject to a minimum of five courses (excluding the courses, Environmental Science and Constitution of India), and

15.2. For admission to B.Com – V Semester, the student shall pass atleast 40% of the Courses of B.Com – I to IV Semesters put together subject to a minimum of ten courses (excluding the courses, Environmental Science and Constitution of India).

16. Declaration of Result, and Announcement of Class and Ranks

16.1. The Degree of Bachelor of Commerce shall be awarded to the candidates who have passed all the courses of all the six semesters of B.Com,

16.2. However, the Class of the Degree shall be awarded only to those students who have passed all the Courses of the last/final two Semesters (i.e., Semesters – V and VI) in the first attempt.

16.3. The Class of passing of B.Com Degree programme shall be announced based on the %age of marks secured in the last/final two semesters (i.e., Semesters – V and VI) in the first attempt as follows.

%age of Marks (Semesters V and VI)	Description of Result
< 40	Fail
$\geq 40 < 50$	Pass

$\geq 60 < 70$	First Class

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17. Rejection of Results

- 17.1. A candidate shall be eligible to reject the result of the whole semester-end examination within such time as may be prescribed by the University from time to time. Rejection of Course-wise result shall not be permitted. This rejection shall be exercised only once in each Semester and the rejection once exercised shall not be revoked, and
- 17.2. The candidate shall apply for rejection of results through the college of study in the prescribed Form along with the original statement of marks by paying such fee as may be prescribed by the University from time to time.

18. Repeal and Savings

- 18.1. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Regulations, the Provisions of any Order, Rule or Regulations in force shall be inapplicable to the extent of their inconsistency with this Regulations,
- 18.2. The University shall issue such orders, instructions, etc and prescribe such format, procedure, etc as it may deem fit to implement the Provisions of this Regulations, and
- 18.3. If any difficulty arises in the implementation of this Regulations, the Vice-chancellor shall, in consultation with the Dean, be competent to issue necessary clarification. And he/she shall, at the earliest possible opportunity thereafter, report the action taken by him/her to the Academic Council for ratification.

Preamble

Kuvempu University is the first affiliate-type university in the state to offer its graduate programs under semester scheme from 2003-04 academic year successfully. However, during this six year period, it has experienced some practical difficulties and also obtained the feedback from its stakeholders including the students' community which is the major stakeholder group. This necessitated a thorough and comprehensive revision of its regulations governing the Bachelor of Business Management Degree Programme. Hence, this Regulations

Regulations governing the Bachelor of Business Management Degree Programme of Kuvempu University under Semester Scheme

(Section 44 (1), Karnataka State Universities Act, 2000)

1. Title and Commencement

1.1 This Regulations shall be called **Kuvempu University Regulations governing the Bachelor of Business Management Degree Programme under Semester Scheme, 2010-11, and**

1.2 This Regulations shall come into force from the date on which it is assented to by the Chancellor.

2. Definitions: In this Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,

2.1 **University** means Kuvempu University,

2.2 **Bachelor of Business Management Degree** means Graduate Degree Programme in Management (B.B.M),

2.3 **Student** means the student admitted to B.B.M Degree Programme under this Regulations,

2.4 **Degree** means Bachelor Degree in Business Management,

2.5 **Board of Studies** means the Board of Studies in Business Management (Graduate Studies) of Kuvempu University,

- 2.6 **Academic Council** means Academic Council of Kuvempu University,
- 2.7 **Fee** means the fee prescribed by the University for B.B.M Programme from time to time, and
- 2.8 **Course** means a logical part of a subject matter of the programme. Alternatively, this shall be called a paper.

3. **Eligibility to Apply for Admission**

- 3.1 The students who have successfully completed the two-year Pre-university examination (PUC) conducted by the Karnataka Pre-university Board or two-year Job-oriented Course or three-year Diploma Course conducted by the Directorate of Vocational Education/Technical Education Board or any other examination considered as equivalent thereto by this University shall be eligible to apply for admission to the first semester of B.B.M Degree Programme,
- 3.2 However, the candidates who have passed the three-year Diploma in Commercial Practice or Secretarial Practice or Modern Office Practice conducted by the Department of Technical Education, Government of Karnataka shall be eligible for admission to the third semester of B.B.M programme directly without the benefit of exemption in any course/s of Semesters III – VI, and
- 3.3 Similarly, the candidates who have passed the two-year Diploma in Business Administration (after PUC) conducted by the Department of Technical Education, Government of Karnataka shall be eligible for admission to fifth semester of B.B.M programme directly without the benefit of exemption in any Course/s of Semesters – V and VI of B.B.M. Further, these candidates shall pass the Language Courses of Semesters I – IV of B.B.M Programme by studying on their own.

4. **Admission of Students of other Universities:** The candidate who has completed the first year or first two years of B.B.M programme in the institution coming under the jurisdiction of other university shall be eligible to take admission to third semester or fifth semester of B.B.M of this University respectively subject to the following conditions.

- 4.1 The candidate should produce the migration certificate from the concerned university,

- 4.2 If the candidate has not successfully completed one or more course/s of Semester/s – I and/or II, or Semester/s – I and/or II and/or III and/or IV of B.B.M, as the case may be, shall take and pass the examination/s of this course/these courses in his/her parent university. Alternatively, the candidate shall take and pass all the courses of first year (Semesters – I and II) or first and second years (Semesters – I to IV) of this University as the case may be,
- 4.3 The candidate who intends to retain the results of the examinations of the university studied previously shall be eligible to do so subject to the condition that he/she is not eligible for any Rank and Class in this University's examination (Regulations 15.1 and 15.2),
- 4.4 The candidate seeking admission to Semester – III or V of B.B.M of this University shall be eligible for admission provided he/she fulfils the requirements of eligibility for promotion to the next higher class (viz., Semester – III or V) in accordance with this Regulations,
- 4.5 Further, the candidate seeking admission to Semester – III or V of B.B.M of this University shall be liable to pass (by self-study) those courses of B.B.M – I year or B.B.M – I and II years of this University if he/she has not studied the same in his/her parent University, and
- 4.6 The candidate who migrates from other university shall also fulfill the conditions and requirements regarding admission prescribed for the students of this University.

5. Duration of the Programme

- 5.1 The Programme of study for B.B.M Degree shall normally extend over a period of three academic years, each academic year comprising of two semesters, and each semester comprising of 16 weeks of class work,
- 5.2 No student shall be permitted to obtain B.B.M Degree earlier than six semesters or to take more than twelve semesters. That means, the student shall complete the academic programme within six years (but not earlier than three academic years) from the date of admission to the first semester of B.B.M Programme, and
- 5.3 Whenever the curricula are revised, and whenever a candidate is reappearing, within the above maximum period (Regulation 5.2), he/she shall be allowed to reappear for the B.B.M Degree examination according to the pre-revised curricula (i.e., the curricula in which he/she has studied the Course/s as regular student).

6. Medium of Instruction

- 6.1 The medium of instruction shall normally be English,
- 6.2 However, the students shall be permitted to write their examination even in Kannada, and
- 6.3 In the case of Languages such as Kannada, Hindi, Sanskrit, Urdu, etc, the medium of instruction and examination shall be in the concerned Language.

7. Structure of B.B.M Programme

- 7.1 The students of B.B.M programme shall study the following courses as prescribed by the Academic Council of the University or other Courses and Course Contents as may be prescribed by the Academic Council of the University from time to time.

- 7.2 Out of the two Languages of Semesters - I to IV of B.B.M selected by the students, at least one shall be an Indian Language such as Kannada, Hindi, Sanskrit, Urdu, Tamil, Telugu, Malayalam, etc. However, in the case of foreign nationals, the requirements of an Indian Language may be waived off by the University,
- 7.3 The student shall be offered the same two Languages for the B.B.M programme which he/she has studied at the Pre-university level. However, a student may opt for Kannada even if he/she has not studied it at the Pre-university level,
- 7.4 The University may permit private study of a Language by a student if the number of students opting for that Language is less-than five, and allow him/her to appear for the examination in that Language without insisting on attendance, and
- 7.5 A student who has taken admission to B.B.M - V Semester shall select any one of the following as his/her Specialization Stream and both the courses in that Stream being compulsory. Course - I of the Specialization Stream selected by the student shall be studied in B.B.M - V Semester and Course - II of the same Specialization Stream shall be studied in B.B.M - VI Semester.

SPECIALIZATION STREAM



Specialization Stream – A: **Human Resource Management**

- Course - I : Human Resource Development
- Course - II : Industrial Relations
- Course - III : Labour Welfare and Social Security
- Course - IV : Labour Laws

Specialization Stream –B: **Marketing Management**

- Course -I : Production and sales Management
- Course -II : Advertising & Media management
- Course -III : International Marketing
- Course -IV : Marketing of Industrial goods.

Specialization Stream –C: **Finance**

- Course -I : Financial Markets and Services
- Course -II : International Finance
- Course -III : Cost and Financial Analysis
- Course -IV : Portfolio Management

Specialization Stream –D: **Information Technology Management**

- Course -I : E-Business and Web Designing
- Course -II : Enterprise Resource Planning
- Course -III : Database Management
- Course -IV : System Analysis and Design.

Specialization Stream –E: **Tourism**

- Course - I : Tourism Industry
- Course - II : Tourism Marketing
- Course -III : Tourism Product
- Course -IV : Travel Agency and Tour Operators Business.

- 7.6 A student in B.B.M – VI Semester shall have the option either to study "Entrepreneurship Development and Small Business Management" course (Course 606) or to take up Project Work, and prepare and submit the Project Report under the guidance of a Teacher before the commencement of examination of Semester - VI,

- 7.7 The candidate who fails to submit the Project Report shall not be permitted to take the whole examination of B.B.M – VI Semester, and
- 7.8 Besides the above Courses (as stated under 7.1 above), the students of B.B.M Programme shall be offered the following additional Courses which are mandatory.
- 7.8.1 Environmental Science shall be offered in III Semester.
- 7.8.2 Constitution of India shall be offered in IV Semester.

8. Attendance

- 8.1 Each course shall be taken as a unit for the purpose of calculating the attendance,
- 8.2 A student shall be considered to have satisfied the requirement of attendance for each course, if he/she has attended not less than 75% of the number of classes held up to the end of the semester including tests, seminars, group discussion, practical, tutorials, special classes and lectures, etc,
- 8.3 However, if a student represents his/her Institution, University, State or Nation in Sports, NCC, NSS or Cultural or any other officially sponsored activities, he/she shall be eligible for the attendance benefit for the actual number of days participated subject to a maximum of 20 days in a semester based on the specific recommendation of the Principal of the Institution concerned. This facility (attendance benefit) shall also be extended to the students who were absent due to accident/serious illness leading to actual hospitalization. In both the cases, the %age of classes attended shall be determined by dividing the number of hours of classes attended (by the student) by the number of hours of classes engaged (excluding the classes held on the days he/she was not present due to hospitalization or participation in sports, etc), and
- 8.4 A student who does not satisfy the requirements of attendance (at least 75% in each course) shall be ineligible to appear for the examination of that whole semester. And he/she shall repeat that semester as regular student in the next year/s.

9. Change of Subjects

- 9.1 Change of subjects (only in the case of Languages and Specialization Streams) shall be permitted by the University, if the requisition from the student is received within 10 days from the date of commencement of the classes on the specific recommendation of the Principal,
- 9.2 Change of subject shall be approved by the University on such terms and conditions as it may deem fit. Option to change the subjects is exercisable by the student/s only once during the three-year period, and
- 9.3 Whenever a change in subject is permitted during a Semester, the attendance in that particular course shall be calculated from the date of change of subject. However, while calculating the attendance for the whole Semester, the attendance in the previous subject studied by the candidate shall also be taken into account.

10. Eligibility to Teach the Courses

- 10.1 All the Courses, except Languages, shall normally be taught by the teachers possessing MBA/M.Com/MBFI Degree,
- 10.2 However, the Courses "Managerial Economics" (Course 104) and "Money and Public Finance" (Course 204) of B.B.M – I and II Semesters respectively shall be taught by the teachers possessing either MBA/M.Com/MBFI/M.A (Economics)/ MBE (Business Economics) Degree,
- 10.3 "Business Mathematics" course (Course 206) of B.B.M – II Semester, and both the Courses of Specialization Stream, Quantitative Techniques, (Courses 507J1 and 607J2) shall be taught by the teachers possessing MBA/ M.Com/ M.Sc. (Mathematics Or Statistics) Degree,
- 10.4 Both the courses of Specialization Stream, "Tourism and Hospitality Management" (Courses 507H1 and 607H2) shall be taught by the teachers possessing MBA/M.Com/MBFI/MTA Degree, and
- 10.5 The Courses, "Information Technology – I and II" (Courses 306 and 406) of B.B.M – III and IV Semesters respectively and both the Courses of Specialization Stream, E-commerce (Courses 507I1 and 607I2) shall be taught by the teachers possessing MBA/ M.Com/ MCA/ M.Sc.(Computer Science)/ M.Tech (Computer Engineering) Degree.

11. Continuous Assessment Programmes and Evaluation

- 11.1 Out of the total marks for each course, 20% shall be earmarked for Continuous Assessment (Internal Assessment) and the remaining 80% for the semester-end examination.
- 11.2 Out of 20 marks for internal assessment, one test shall be conducted, preferably during the third week of third month of the semester (with a provision for re-test, if a student wishes, before the close of semester classes), and the remaining 10 marks shall be earmarked for the maintain the record of the Skill Developmental Activities,
- 11.3 In the case of Project Report, it (Project Report) shall be evaluated for 80 marks and the viva-voce examination shall be conducted by the Departmental Council of the College for the remaining 20 marks,
- 11.4 The marks obtained in the tests and the skill developmental activities shall be displayed on the notice board of the College,
- 11.5 In each of the activities pertaining to the internal assessment marks, complete transparency shall be ensured by the course teacher, and the student who is not satisfied with the marks awarded to him/her can make an appeal to the Head of the Department with justifiable reasons. On the receipt of appeal, the Head of the Department shall convene a meeting of the Departmental Council and redress the grievances of the student appropriately,
- 11.6 In case of candidates who appear for improvement examination, and/or the students who take the examination in the failed course/s, the marks obtained in the internal assessment shall not be revised. There shall be no improvement for internal assessment, and
- 11.7 Student-wise and Course-wise internal assessment marks shall be communicated to the Office of the Registrar (Eval) by the Principal of the College before the commencement of University examination and the University shall have access to the records of continuous assessment for verification, if necessary.
- 11.8 In case of candidates who appear for improvement examination and/or the students who take the examination in the failed course/s, the marks obtained in the internal assessment shall not be revised. There shall be no improvement for internal assessment, and

- 11.9 Student-wise and Course-wise internal assessment marks shall be communicated to the Office of the Registrar (Evaluation) by the Principal of the College before the commencement of University examination and the University shall have access to the records of the continuous assessment for verification, if necessary.
12. **Appearance for the Examination:** A candidate shall apply for all the courses of a Semester when he/she appears for the examination of that Semester for the first time.
13. **Question Paper Setting and Evaluation:** All the Courses, except Languages, of B.B.M Degree Programme shall be under the Board of Examiners in BBM (Graduate Studies) for the purpose of examination – setting of question papers and evaluation of answer scripts.
14. **Evaluation, Revaluation and Minimum Marks for Pass**
- 14.1 Every answer script in the semester-end examination shall be subjected to coded, central and single evaluation,
- 14.2 A candidate shall be declared to have passed the examination if he/she obtains not less-than 40% marks in aggregate in each semester and 35% of the maximum marks including internal assessment marks in each course (including Project Report) provided he/she secures atleast 35% of the maximum marks in each Course in the semester-end examination. However, there shall be no minimum for internal assessment marks,
- 14.3 A candidate obtaining less-than 35% of the maximum marks and/or 35% of marks in the semester-end examination in any course shall be declared to have failed in that course. Such a candidate shall be eligible to take the examination in the failed course/s at a subsequent examination and he/she shall secure not less-than 35% of the maximum marks for pass in that course/s including 35% marks in the semester- end examination,
- 14.4 A student who desires to get his/her answer script/s revalued may do so by submitting an application along with the prescribed fee to the Registrar (Evaluation) within 15 days from the date of announcement of the result. Such answer script/s shall be got valued by another external examiner. The marks awarded to that answer script/s shall be the average of two marks. However, if the difference in the marks between the two evaluations exceeds 15%, the script shall be referred to the third internal evaluation. In this type of

situation, the marks awarded to that script shall be the average of the two nearer marks out of the three evaluations,

- 14.5 However, in the case of Project Report, there shall be double evaluation – one by the concerned guide at the college level and another by one of the examiners from the panel of examiners. The chairman of BoE in BBM (Graduate Studies) shall arrange for the second evaluation of the Project Reports in the concerned college by deputing the external examiners (i.e., the examiners from other colleges with the University jurisdiction) to the college,
- 14.6 The Principal of the College shall submit the marks list of both the examiners, after the evaluations, to the Office of the Registrar (Eval) before the completion of B.B.M – VI Semester examination. If the difference in the marks between the two evaluations exceeds 15% of the maximum marks, then such a report shall be referred to the third examiner. And in this type of situation, the marks to be awarded to the project report shall be the average of the nearer two out of three evaluations,
- 14.7 The candidate shall obtain a minimum of 35 marks in the Project Report failing which he/she shall revise and resubmit the Project Report before the commencement of the next examination. However, no candidate shall be allowed to resubmit the Project Report after three consecutive chances,
- 14.8 The result of the successful candidate at B.B.M – VI Semester examination shall be declared as NCL (not completed lower examination) if he/she has not successfully completed the lower examination, and
- 14.9 The Degree of Bachelor of Business Management shall be awarded to the candidates who have passed all the courses of Semesters – I to VI Semesters of B.B.M.

15. Promotion to Next Higher Semester

- 15.1 For admission to B.B.M – III Semester, a student shall pass atleast 40% of the Courses of B.B.M – I and II Semesters put together subject to a minimum of five courses (excluding the courses, Environmental Science and Constitution of India), and
- 15.2 For admission to B.B.M – V Semester, the student shall pass atleast 40% of the Courses of B.B.M – I to IV Semesters put together subject to a minimum of ten courses (excluding the courses, Environmental Science and Constitution of India).

16. **Declaration of Result, and Announcement of Class and Ranks**

- 16.1 The Degree of Bachelor of Commerce shall be awarded to the candidates who have passed all the courses of all the six semesters of B.B.M,
- 16.2 However, the Class of the Degree shall be awarded only to those students who have passed all the Courses of the last/final two Semesters (i.e., Semesters – V and VI) in the first attempt,
- 16.3 The Class of passing of B.B.M Degree programme shall be announced based on the %age of marks secured in the last/final two semesters (i.e., Semesters – V and VI) in the first attempt as follows.

%age of Marks (Semesters V and VI)	Description of Result
< 40	Fail
≥ 40 < 50	Pass
≥ 50 < 60	Second Class
≥ 60 < 70	First Class
≥ 70	First Class with Distinction

- 16.4 **Award of Ranks** – A candidate shall be eligible for the Ranks for the whole course provided he/she passed in all the course of the Semester in First attempt only and marks secured in the V and VI Semesters. The no. of Ranks announced shall be limited to 10 only.

17. **Rejection of Results**

- 17.1 A candidate shall be eligible to reject the result of the whole semester-end examination within such time as may be prescribed by the University from time to time. Rejection of Course-wise result shall not be permitted. This rejection shall be exercised only once in each Semester and the rejection once exercised shall not be revoked, and
- 17.2 The candidate shall apply for rejection of results through the college of study in the prescribed Form along with the original statement of marks by paying such fee as may be prescribed by the University from time to time.

18. **Repeal and Savings**

- 18.1 Notwithstanding anything contained in this Regulations, the Provisions of any Order, Rule or Regulations in force shall be inapplicable to the extent of their inconsistency with this Regulations,
- 18.2 The University shall issue such orders, instructions, etc and prescribe such format, procedure, etc as it may deem fit to implement the Provisions of this Regulations, and
- 18.3 If any difficulty arises in the implementation of this Regulation, the Vice-chancellor shall, in consultation with the Dean, be competent to issue necessary clarification. And he/she shall, at the earliest possible opportunity thereafter, report the action taken by him/her to the Academic Council for ratification.

19. **Question paper pattern for semester-end examinations**

Each question paper shall be divided into three sections viz., Section – A (conceptual), Section – B (analytical) and Section – C (application).

Section – A

- Maximum Marks: 20
- One Question comprising of twelve sub-questions and the students have to answer any ten sub-questions.
- Each sub-question carries two marks,
- Answer to each sub-question shall be in few sentences, and
- However, for the purpose of convenience, the students shall answer all ten sub- questions of this section at one place continuously preferably in the first five pages.

Section – B

- Maximum Marks: 15
- Three Questions shall be answered out five Questions (including four problems in the case of quantitative subjects),
- Each question carries five marks, and
- Answer to each theory question shall be in not more than two pages.

- Maximum Marks: 45
- Three Questions shall be answered out five questions (including four problems in the case of quantitative subjects),
- Each Question carries fifteen marks, and
- Answer to each theory Question shall be in not more than six pages.

Note: Calculators, Mathematical Tables and Present Value Tables are allowed.
