

Theme :

Various forms/genres such as Memoirs, Biographies, Autobiographies, Confessions, Reminiscences have increasingly been used as archives of social history across disciplines constituting them under the rubric "Life-writing". The methodologies of interpreting these forms of writing /committing life to language are still in the nascent stage. These genres can also be explored as critical practices, and it is relevant to conceptualize/re-conceptualize the social and material context of the emergence of these narratives. The interdisciplinary nature of the genre and its discursive undercurrents representing an alternative space other than the normative and the dominant merit detailed attention. Confessional politics of life writings reflecting diversity of positions imbued with the personal and the public dimensions of individual experience heralds a new dimension of expression across cultures.

Narratives by women, blacks, dalits, tribals, displaced, marginalized and the underprivileged across cultures and continents and complexities of cultural process necessitating these narratives would be the focus of the conference. The conference intends to generate a debate on the nature of these narratives and their significance for gleaning a socio-cultural history of communities and nations
